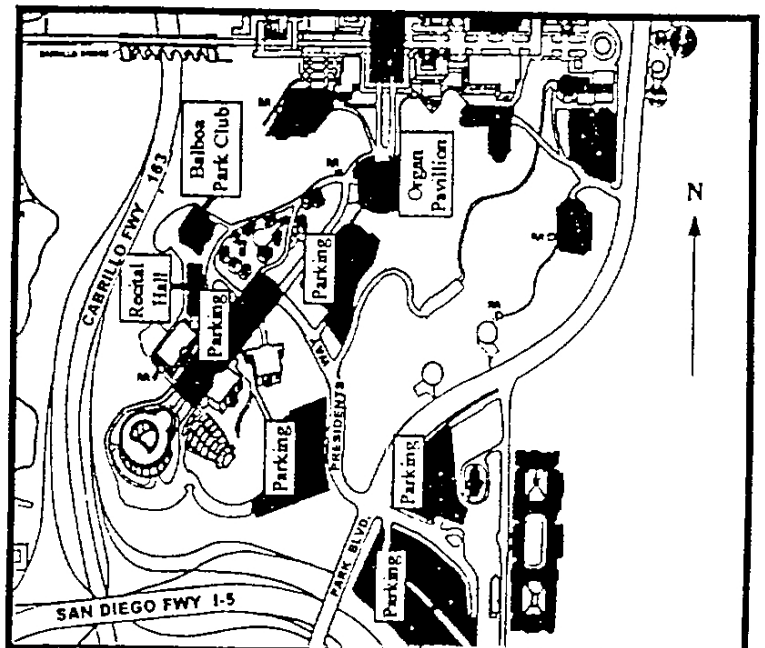

PASSOVER ROLLS

2 cups matzo meal
 5 teaspoon sugar
 1 teaspoon salt
 1 cup water
 ½ cup oil
 4 eggs

Sprinkle salt and sugar over matzo meal. Bring to a boil the water mixed with the oil and immediately pour over matzo meal. Add the eggs, mix well, and let mixture rest for 15 minutes. With wet hands shape the batter into balls and with a wet knife mark x-shaped incisions on top (this will help the rolls to brown evenly). Bake at 350° for 50 minutes. If rolls brown too much before baking time is over cover loosely with foil and continue baking until done. Bon appetit! ~Gerda Ben Zeev

MATZO FARFEL SOUFFLÉ

4 cups matzo farfel
 4 eggs separated
 4 tbsp sugar
 2 tsp vanilla extract
 Zest from 1 lemon
 4 apples (Granny Smith or Pippin)
 4 tbsp apricot marmalade
 2 tbsp matzo meal
 ½ cup crushed walnuts (optional)
 A handful of raisins (optional)

Pour cold water over the matzo farfel to cover, and drain immediately. Mix in the egg yolks, one at a time, followed by vanilla, lemon zest, and part of the walnuts if used.

Preheat oven at 350° and prepare a well-buttered soufflé dish.

Peel and core apples, slice thinly. Mix in marmalade, matzo meal, raisins and the remainder of the walnuts.

Whip egg whites, mix in the sugar and continue beating until stiff peaks form. Slowly fold the egg white mixture into the matzo farfel mixture. Place half of the batter into the soufflé dish, add the apples and cover with the remaining batter. Bake at 350° for 45 min. Serve hot. ~Gerda Ben Zeev

RUSSIAN SWEET ROLLS

Last summer, while on a Russian River cruise, the food was not to my liking except for the breads and soups (and caviar!). It really didn't matter. The Russian people were friendly and the scenery spectacular. Then one evening, I was greatly surprised when dessert was served. It was sweet rolls, exactly like my grandmother and mother used to make.

I would love it you would help me preserve our family recipe. Use your creativity and make it your own.

1 can evaporated milk (not condensed)
 2 cubes margarine or butter, Smart Balance, etc.
 2 packages dry yeast
 ¼ cup warm water
 4 cups flour
 1 tbsp salt
 1 cup sugar
 5 beaten eggs
 Flour
 Fillings, your choice
 (raisins, nuts, coconut, jelly, etc.)

Bring the milk to scalding and cut in the margarine. Remove from heat. Place yeast in warm water and blend. Sift four cups of flour. Make a groove in the center. Pour the yeast into the groove. Cover the bowl and let it stand. When the milk has cooled, add to the flour and yeast, along with the eggs, sugar, and salt. Add enough flour to make a soft dough. The dough should not be sticky, but rather smooth and elastic. Cover, let rise for about three hours.

Divide the dough, and shape on a floured surface into desired cakes and rolls. (My mother would roll the dough out, spread a little oil on it, then spread jelly, nuts, coconuts, maraschino cherries, or whatever similar ingredients she had on hand. She would then roll the dough into a log, bring the ends together to make a circle, and place in a greased pie pan.) After forming cakes, cover and let rise again until doubled in size. Brush with milk slash cakes with a sharp knife, and sprinkle with sugar if you wish. Bake at 350° until golden.
