nce upon a time in the village of **Ojai** a stranger, David Young, arrived from the far off country of Berkeley. After settling, he introduced a new activity which he called **Folk Dance** . Now this new diversion **Folk Dance**, so enthralled the local people that the leaders of the local clans (the **Ojai Valley Community Art Center**, the **Ojai City Council**, the **Girl and Boy Scouts of America**, the **Camp Fire Girls** and the local public schools) all decided to help this stranger , who was no longer a stranger, put on a village fair. They hoped this fair would attract wanderers from far off places in far off lands to come to their village and partake in this new merriment called **Folk Dance**. So in 1946 the village of **Ojai** closed off its main thorough fare and wanderers from near and far came and they came and they came until the street was full of 300-500 revelers. Entertainment was provided by groups of performers , food was served and dancing was done by all to music from many lands well into the night. The festival programs included **Gustav Skoal**, **Troika**, **Hopak** ,**Korubuska**, **Hambo Alexandrovska**, and the **Italian Quadrille**. The next day, when all was recounted, the tribes from the northern empire met with the newly formed tribes from the southern empire and all agreed that the village fair would be called **STATEWIDE** and, would be held every year with different villages being host. As time passed and traditions grew, banners were created and new exciting activities were added: concerts, institutes, and costume parades.

The southern most village in the realm, **San Diego**, will host **STATEWIDE** in 1999. It has hosted **STATEWIDE** four times in the past (second only to **FRESNO**).



The first STATEWIDE in *San Diego*, "THE DOWN-UNDER STATEWIDE FESTIVAL", was held in 1957 at Balboa Park. This statewide, chaired by Vivian Woll and Vytis Beliajus, ushered in the first dance concert, or pageant as it was called. The weekend also included a tour of a local wild animal conservator call the Zoo and a trip to a far off land called Tijuana. Simultaneous Folk Dance and Square Dance Festivals were held.



The next *San Diego* festival was in 1965, the "CARNATION FESTIVAL" was held at the *San Diego* Convention Center. In addition to the now traditional concert, a costume fashion show was part of the weekend. The Monday picnic was held in the Vacation Village in Mission Bay Park. Alice Hauseman and Vivian Woll were the noble leaders for this event.



In 1969 "FIESTA 200" was held in *San Diego* at the Convention Hall. Alice Hauserman, the general chair person, added a special feature for this STATEWIDE by starting it on Thursday and ended it on Sunday. For this festival, a costume photo session was featured.



In 1973 **STATEWIDE**, spearheaded by Vivian Woll, returned to **San Diego** for "Sights of San Diego" with the dancing on Friday returning to Balboa Park Club, while Saturday and Sunday events were held at Community Concourse.



The last time that **STATEWIDE** was in **San Diego** was in 1979 **WHEN** Vivian Woll and Evelyn Prewett gave us "a whale of a time". Once again, Friday night was held at the Balboa Park club with Saturday and Sunday at the community concourse. Instead of a picnic on Monday, a full festival was scheduled.

Our story ends (for now) with the beginning. Each new **STATEWIDE** begins with a search across the land for the perfect combination of place and a noble leader . The place must be of great hospitality, with a great space available for the merriment. This space has led many a noble leader on an endless quest. The noble leader must have a great following; there are many duties to delegate, many ritual to perform, and many people to please from both near and far. Many activities must be planned, enough to please the crowd from many different parts of the realm. Fabulous artisans must be invited and dignitaries honored. The people demand the most famous of choreographers to teach them new steps, the most talented of performers

to entertain them and the most able of musicians to play for them, for if it were not done so, then it could not be called **STATEWIDE**.

Once again **San Diego** has been chosen. They have the great hall known as "Balboa Park Club" which is of beautiful construction, the finest in the southern empire. They have the noble leader, Renee Fry. They have planned new events : IFD and Cajun/Zydeco on Friday night, IFD and Latin-Salsa on Saturday and IFD and Swing-Lindy on Sunday evening.

Once again **STATEWIDE** will live on in tradition And now my story ends for I must prepare for my journey to **STATEWIDE!!**

ARM SWINGS

Arm swings with Setnja? What's next? Lesnoto? Trgnala Rumjana? How about Tino Mori?

When Yves was here in St. Louis last year, he taught a fun, fairly simple dance to a really nice song whose name I don't remember. It took everybody about 15 minutes to get the steps. But then, instead of saying "OK, let's do it," he said "OK, now it's time for the arm choreography." Instantly, for about half the people in the circle, including me, enthusiasm and anticipation were replaced by dread and aggravation. The sighs, groans and muttered profanity were so audible that Yves said apologetically (not an exact quote): "I know how some you feel about arms, but that's the way the dance is. I can't help it."

Well, it's more than a feeling. Lots of people simply can't do arms and feet at the same time. Luckily for me, there was no such thing as swinging arms when I started in 1961. There's no way I or any other arms-impaired person could break into Balkan dancing today. I suspect that the decline of Balkan dancing as a mass activity coincides with the spread of arm choreography, pinky holds, and that anatomical impossibility -- the inside basket hold.

On the other hand, maybe not. End of rant and rave.
