I had always wanted to take those tap/ballet/tumbling classes when I was a little girl, but my father insisted that I have 2 years of piano lessons first. By the time I qualified, I had moved on to other things. I didn't get back to dancing till my first marriage ended and I was looking around for



something new to occupy my time. I decided to give folk dancing a try.

I spent the first few years of folk dancing feeling really clumsy and stumbling around with my eyes glued to the feet of other dancers who seemed to know what they were doing. I joined Narodni International Folk Dancers after a year or so. I gradually became one of the people who keep things going, and here I am 30 or so years later, still part of that group. I started as punch chairman, and then became treasurer for several years.

Once I got good enough at dancing to look up now and then, it became a lot more fun. I started by going to a few Federation festivals and then attending Federation meetings and getting more involved. I have been a delegate for my club, then Federation secretary (back when we had 2 of them: recording secretary and corresponding secretary). I have been historian, vice president, president, and now I am your insurance chairman.


Things have changed a lot over the years. Taking care of insurance for Federation used to involve lots of paperwork, mailing and filing. With the changes in technology, I no longer have to rely so much on the US Mail. Most communication can be done via computer and I only have to use snail mail when I need to send paperwork with a payment for something. I used to have to store everything in big, thick binders, but this last year, all the certificates have come to me over the internet and I can forward them to the clubs without all those envelopes and stamps. I can store almost everything on my computer and a flash drive!

Although the paperwork takes up a lot less space, insurance issues have become increasingly complicated. If you are taking care of insurance issues for your group, feel free to call me or email me with any questions or problems. It is always good to send me a copy of your facility insurance requirements and/or contract when you send your certificate request. That way I can make sure that your facility doesn't



DANCE WORKSHOP PARTNERS

We drove up to Ventura for the dance workshop that Valerie had announced at the Pasadena Folk dance Co-op – found the venue in an industrial area south of the freeway, just west of Victoria – and there she was, outside, meeting and greeting! Tables were set up there for registration, and chairs were also outside the roll-up door, leaving the long, narrow bay uncluttered for dancing. Six teachers presented half-hour segments of instruction in their genres, starting with a warm-up *Gay Gordons*, and stretches.

I enjoyed the social aspect: everybody seemed confident in having a good time, and couples were mixed or rotated for most of the teaching, I got to learn dances with many partners who were cheerful and engaging. Being on such a narrow, long floor I lost track of my partner, Pat, when it would have been better for us to share the Scandinavian dance experience. Toward the end I had no partner at the start of the ballroom teaching. There were a couple and a young woman not yet committed; the couple encouraged us to dance together. The teacher borrowed her for demonstrations, and I too appreciated dancing with her before we progressed, changing partners.

Megan stood out, tall Her youthful beauty full fluffy fall of curly red hair a pleasure to move closely together without touching we smiled and she joked about my seeing past her hair The teachers did a good job of introducing easy dances – or elements of the style, in the case of the ballroom teaching. I was pleased that Valerie started with



Believe, a community feel-good dance from Japan, before moving on to *Dramskoto*, a pleasing Bulgarian dance of moderate challenge, and *Hora Veche*, a Romanian dance only a bit harder, then demonstrated – and invited participation by those who knew it – *Adama Veshamayim*, a really fast and showy Israeli dance; a nice progression.

This event was in part a celebration of the newlyinstalled flooring of the fencing studio. The owner and a colleague demonstrated some moves, discussed the origin of the sport in trying to save the lives of duelists, and explained scoring and showed the weapons: foil, épée, and saber.

On New Year's Eve, December 31 per the Gregorian calendar, we went to St. Mary's Macedonian Church in Whittier. Again, my favorite Macedonian accordionist was playing and did not disappoint. He even aimed one song my way – *Milke Duso*. I thoroughly appreciated that!

When it rains, it pours. Chris played again on January 11 at St. Mary's Macedonian Church for New Year's Eve per the Julian calendar. This time he was joined by Walt Mahovlich (Ohio), Rumen Shopov (formerly from Bulgaria, now from Oakland), and Paul Morrissett (New Jersey). Dancers from the SoCal folk dance community joined with the local Macedonians to enjoy an old tradition. The energy was palpable and the music was outstanding. What a fantastic job by this composite band!

I think I should have my DNA done. Deep down, I think I'm Macedonian.


