CANADIAN BARN DANCE England

This is an old traditional dance, originaly source unknwn. Elinor Vandergrift leanred the dance in school in England.

MUSIC:

"A Call from the North," The Wick Scottish Dance Band, E.M.I. Talisman STAL 5029, side 2, band 4.

FORMATION:

Round the room cpl dance. Dance can be done continously with the same ptr or progressively with a new ptr.

Dancers face LOD with nearer hand joined at shidr ht. W

on M's R.

STEPS:

Schottische: 3 steps fwd/bkwd (cts 1-3); hop (ct 4).

METER: 4/4

PATTERN

Meas.

DANCE:

- 1 Leading with outside ft, do one schottische fwd.
- 2 Do one schottische bkwd with inside ft.
- 3 With cpls facing LOD, move diag away from ptr with 1 schottische. Clap on hop.
- Moving diag twd ptr do 1 schottische. End in ballroom pos. If dance is being done progressively, the progression takes place at this time with W moving diag fwd to the next M in front of ptr, while M move in twd the W behind his orig ptr.
- 5 Do 1 schottische fwd in LOD.
- 6 Do 1 schottische bkwd in RLOD.
- 7-8 Do 4 step-hops turning in LOD. Finish facing LOD with nearer hands.

Repeat dance from beginning.
