Paparuda

Ritual dance from Moldova, Romania Presented by Sonia Dion and Cristian Florescu

Paparuda is the name of an ancient Romanian deity that people appeal to for rain in times of extreme heat or drought.

Paparuda also refers to a magic ritual practised in Romania. Similar rituals with different names are found in other countries.

Originally the ritual was carried out on a set date, probably the spring equinox. Under pressure from Christianity, it was moved to the third Thursday after Easter. Nowadays it is held only occasionally, during a period of severe drought.

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The three-part ceremony begins with "the birth." Young people are bedecked with leaves and a crown of flowers. This part must always be done next to a water source. The procession comes next, when the young people dance their way through the village, the rhythm set by their singing. As they pass, the villagers douse them with water or occasionally with milk. They also make them offerings such as food, money or small objects. In the third part, called "the burial," the members of the procession return to the water source, remove their "costumes" of leaves and crowns and throw them in the water.

2-8 Repeat measure **1**, seven more times (8 in total)

Style:

During the figure **2**, arms are moving together from side to side (Onto R and L according to the ftwk). This movement can be done arms down or at waist level or up above head. Freely, the dancers could add some turns during the figure.

Final pattern:

 $(F1 + F2) \ge 4.$
