



COSTUME CORNER

Georgian Costumes Fit the Dances

Georgia, or Gruzia, lies in the westernmost area of the southern Caucasus Mountains, bordering on the Black Sea. Famous as the birthplace of Stalin (Russian for "Man of Steel"—his original Georgian family name was Jughashvili), it is also famous for its spectacular mountain scenery, and for its tongue-twisting language, unrelated to any other language of Europe. One quickly notices that its consonants are prone to pile up in great log-jams, as in the name of its capital, Tblisi—or try the word for a trainer: *mts'vrtneli*. Georgia is also known for its astonishing dances and costumes.



The women, wearing particularly long, willowy, form-fitting gowns, sail around gracefully as they dance—sometimes so smoothly you would think they are on skates—while punctuating the rhythms with delicate hand movements (*Photo 1*). But beautiful though they are, the men regularly upstage them with their heroics (*Photo 2*).

Photo 1 (on left): Georgian couple dancing, with the man up on the backs of his toes. Woman's long veil over a high, crown-like headdress is common; likewise the slim waist and long full skirt. Note too, the ultra-long sleeves on both costumes: graceful for dancing, and useful as mittens in the long cold season.

To begin with, the men usually dress in black and white. Over their tight black pants and white shirt they wear a slim-waisted black coat with elbow-length sleeves and flaring skirts, called a chakha or chokha (Photo 3). The most iconic detail of the chakha is the bandolier-like row of cartridge pouches across the upper chest—grim reminder of centuries of quarding their homeland against many comers. (Bandoliers were common among European soldiers from the 16th to 19th centuries.) To this weaponry is often added a dagger, stuck

into the belt (*Photos 1, 4*). Above, the men

often sport a very shaggy and bushy black cap, while below, the men's feet are shod in kneehigh black boots, of soft leather so closely fitted that it moves like a second skin.

In dancing, the men also sail about gracefully (Photos 1, 4), especially as they gallantly squire a lady across the floor. But then they hop up onto the backs of their toes (not the tips, as a ballet dancer does), with only the soft but tight boots as support (Photos 1, 5), and launch into stunning sequences of spins, high kicks and leaps. The effect is electric—but don't try it at home! It takes much practice to learn to dance safely, not to mention gracefully, on curled-back feet!

ANDOR CZOMPO



November 30, 1929 – December 3, 2019

Andor Czompo, age 90, of Williamsburg and native of Budapest, Hungary, passed away on December 3rd 2019. He was preceded in death by his father Andor Czompo of Turkeve, Hungary and his mother Laura Kiss Czompo of Budapest, Hungary. He leaves behind his beloved wife of 55 years, Ann Czompo of Williamsburg and a son, Andor Steven Czompo of Rochester, NY.

He was enlisted in the Hungarian Army from 1950-1952. He also acquired a liberal arts certificate from St. Bernat Gymnasium and a teacher's certificate from the Hungarian State Folk Institute. Andor was known for his love of everything Hungarian such as folklore, costumes, and music. He was also known for his love for photography, swimming and for his many faithful dogs. Most of all, he will be remembered as a teacher and mentor. He retired in 1991 from SUNY Cortland.

His proudest accomplishment was that he was a master teacher who conducted Hungarian dance and folklore workshops and master classes at many major universities and folk dance camps worldwide.
