Depicts stories of the Japanese fishing community that flourished on Terminal Island prior to WWII, the tuna industry, sea rescues, and daring, early industrial divers.

Old Firehouse 36 Museum

One of the oldest buildings in San Pedro Fridays 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Volunteers and exhibits recount firefighting history at the port.

Battleship Iowa

Daily 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Tour the ship to discover machinery, life aboard during WW II, the Korean and cold wars. Or sit on the sunny USS lowa deck and sip a draft beer. Locals recommend the hotdogs served on board at Vicky's Doghouse.

Park in the public lot at 6th and Harbor Blvd. near Maritime Museum and ride the trolley to the Farmers Market and nearby restaurants, galleries and shops. The free red trolley runs a continuous loop from 11:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on Fridays.

Browse art galleries and vintage shops

Take a selfie at the fountain in the elegant Arcade building, 479 W. 6th, enjoy a Gelato at the Candy Shop Sweet Susie next door in the Brown Brothers Building. Stay alert for colorful murals in unexpected places all around the neighborhood. Port Town Brewery is scheduled to open by May in the old Liberty Auditorium at 7th St. and Center. Murals on the window depict the building's history.

White Point Nature Center

White Point Beach

Below, can be accessed by road down to the beach. Sturdy shoes required for a walk east on the rocks. To the west find a terrazzo floor under the palm trees, site of a historic dance club.

Park in the free signed parking lot and walk down the stairs to the beach (and back up!).

Point Fermin Park

Located 2 blocks from Wigwam Lodge

Paved paths along bluff. Tours of the historic (1874) Point Fermin Lighthouse are offered at 1:00, 2:00, and 3:00 p.m. Call to reserve your place on a tour. Up the steep hill from Pt. Fermin Park find an enormous bronze bell of friendship given to the people of Los Angeles by the Republic of Korea. The pagoda is in Angels Gate Park which offers a splendid view and cool breeze year 'round.

Sunday afternoon offers an additional opportunity to enjoy activities unique to San Pedro. When dancing concludes at noon in Wigwam the party continues 2 miles up the road at Crafted at the Port of LA, Warehouse #10, 112 E. 22nd St. <u>https://</u><u>craftedportla.com/</u>. Wander through the stalls of independent artisans, watch artists demonstrating their techniques, enjoy a beverage at the adjacent brewery <u>https://</u><u>www.brouwerijwest.com/</u> Order a shrimp tray or smash burger from the Fish Market or buy lunch from one of the ethnic food trucks on site. If you prefer a more upscale meal, make reservations for lunch at 22nd St. Landing Seafood Grill & Bar across the street.

SS Lane Victory Museum Ship

\$5 per senior. Free parking. Located at end of Miner St., San Pedro Open until 4:00 p.m. Sunday Volunteers explain the Victory ships' role in WW2, and how Victory ships transported Korean refugees to new homes in LA after the Korean War. No ladders to climb, good view of the harbor. A unique distinction: the SS Lane is the only boat **registered** in Los Angeles.

About the Harbor View Festival location

Wigwam Lodge is an American craftsman construction built in 1915 as a library for the San Pedro Community. The building was designated #24 in 2003 on the list of Los Angeles Historical & Cultural Monuments. Members of the fraternal organization reactivated their membership in 2011 to prevent the sale of the hall to a private party. The focus of the club, Sequoia Tribe #140, is the community of San Pedro. They support Alzheimer's research by sponsoring events in the hall. This intimate lodge is warm and welcoming, and quite a contrast to spacious and elegant Smith Hall where the Federation sponsored Statewide in 2019.
