## AVANT-DEUX DU POITOU

(Poitou - France)

After the Bourrée, the Avant-Deux is a very widespread form of dance in several districts of Central and Western France. It is always done in contra line formation and the figures are prompted by a caller. In this recording, there is a small pause between repeats of the dance where the caller dedicates the next round to particular people: bride, mother-in-law etc.)

Rhythm:

Formation:

Two fairly long lines of cpls in "contra" formation (longways). Cpl

facing cpl. The "opposite" is the person across from you. W on M's R. Arms are

free down at sides.

Basic step:

Step onto R, then L, then R, in a fwd direction (cts

1,2,3). hold (ct 4) strong step on L (ct 1) hop on L, extending R leg fwd (ct 3).

This step is done in a fwd and a bkwd direction.

Buzz step:

This is very much like a "swing your ptr" step)

Slide:

This is like a "chassé" or "gallop" step in ballroom pos. which travels fwd

and back.

13-16	Repeat pattern of meas 9-12, ending up in original place	
3 cts 1-8	2. Balancez (swing) When caller says "balancez", all stamp 3 times (L-R-L) Do 16 buzz-swings with prtnr in ballroom pos.	
3 cts 1-2 3-4 5-6 7-8	3. Rassemblez (present-slide) Same as in Fig. 2 but use R-L-R Slide to opp cpl Slide back to place Repoeat pattern of meas 1-2 Instead of sliding back to place, keep going fwd, passing through and ending up trading places with opp cpl.
