KASTRINOS (Crete, Greece)

The Kastrinos (kahs-tree-NOHS) is from the town of Iraklion Source: in Crete. The name derives from the word "kastro" (castle or fort) and the kastro in Iraklion. Other names for this dance are Irakliotikos, Malevyziotikos, Sitiakos. It is one of the

four most popular Cretan dances.
