**SOURCE :** In ancient Greece, inhabitants were known to have settled in the Black Sea region. During the population exchange between Turkey and Greece in 1922, many people came to Greece from the Black Sea region. These people were called Lazoi (from «Hellas - zoi» — Greece lives). Thus one of their popular dances is named Laziko.

### PATTERN

Fig. I

Meas.

- 1 In place, step R (Q), step L (Q), step R (S).
- 2 In place, step L (Q), step R (Q), step L (S).
- 3-8 Repeat meas. 1-2.

Fig. II

- 1 Holding shoulders and facing LOD, take running steps, RLR (QQS), accenting with a stamp on the «S» step.
- 2 LRL
- 3-8 Repeat meas. 1-2.

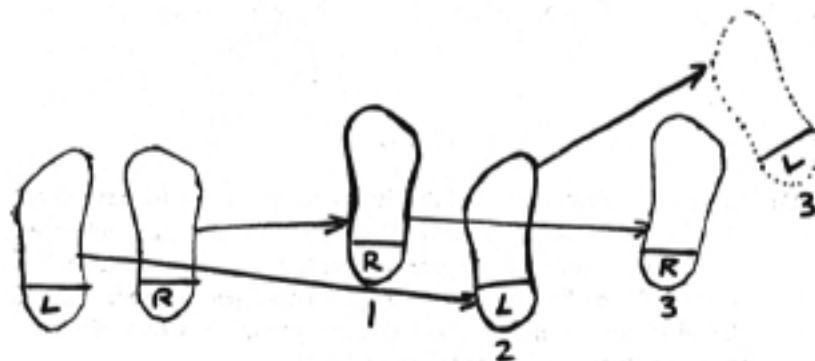
Fig. III

- 1 Step R to R, cross L behind, step R with R, accenting the step and bending R knee, left foot in air (QQS).
- 2 Repeat with opp. ftwk. and opp. direction.
- 3-8 Repeat meas. 1-2.

Fig. IV

- 1 Facing LOD, step R, L and point R, holding the count, wt. on L, thus we start again.
- 2 Repeat meas. 1.
- 3-8 Repeat meas. 1-2.
