Any suitably phrased 32 bar reel.

FORMATION: Set of 4 couples in longways formation.

Bow and curtsey*, hands across*, cast up*, cast down*, move up*, move down*, STEPS and STYLING: rights and lefts*.

Skip change of step*, beg R, used throughout the dance.

PATTERN

2/4 meter MUSIC

INTRODUCTION M bow and W curtsey to ptr. Chord

- I. HANDS ACROSS; WOMAN CAST, MAN FOLLOW
- 1 4Cpls 1 and 2 dance right hands across once around. W 1 end facing out on W side.
- 5-6 W 1, followed by M 1, cast down one place.
- 7-8 W 1 cross the set to M 2 place, facing out. M 1 end in W 2 place. Cpl 2 move up.
- 9-12 Cpls 1 and 3 dance left hands across once around. W 1 end facing out on M side.
- 13 14W 1, followed by M 1, cast down one place.
- Cpl 1 end in the ctr of the set facing up and take nearer hands. Cpl 3 15 - 16move up.
 - II. LEAD UP AND CAST; LEAD DOWN AND CAST
- Cpl 1 dance up the ctr to above Cpl 2. 1 - 2
- Releasing hands, Cpl l cast down one place on own side. 3-4

 - III. RIGHTS AND LEFTS

- 192 meas
- Chord



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Cpl l dance into ctr of set, M l going between M 2 and 3, W l between W 2 and 3. Taking nearer hands, dance down between Cpl 3. Releasing hands, Cpl l cast up to 2nd place on own side. Cpl 3 move down to

Cpls 2 and 1 dance rights and lefts.

M bow and W curtsey to ptr.

Cpl 1 repeat the dance from 2nd place dancing with Cpls 3 and 4. Cpl 1 go to the bottom of the set on the outside as the new top cpl begins. Dance pattern as written with Cpls 2, 3 and 4 active each in turn.

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
