PENDOZÁLIS

(Crete)

A well known dance from Crete the name means "Five Steps". The word <u>ZALI</u> is a Cretan dialect word for dance step. Although originally the Pendozáli was most associated with the district of Rethymnon, it is now a pan-Cretan dance. It is usually preceded by the <u>Sighanós</u>, meaning "slow", an easy going dance during which rhymed couplets called <u>Mandinádhes</u> are sung. The purely instrumental and fast version of Pendozali is often called <u>Ortses</u>.

MUSIC:

Dances of Greece 1994

FORMATION:

Semi-circle, shoulder hold.

METER: 2/4

PATTERN

Meas

BASIC

- 1 Step L in place (or slightly fwd into ctr of circle) (ct 1); Swing R fwd (or fwd and across L), hopping on L in place (ct 2).
- Leap R back to place, kicking L (straight legged) to the R (ct 1); Leap step L to the L (ct 2); Cross and step R in front of L (ct &).
- Rock back onto L (ct 1); Step R to the R (ct 2); Step close L next to R or step L behind and across R (ct &)
- 4 Step R to the R (ct 1); Swing L fwd and across R (ct 2).

NOTE:

The dance is often started on meas. 4, stepping R in place ct 1.

NOTE:

Meas. 3 can be performed almost in place or with travelling steps to the right.

<u>VARIANT I</u>

- 1 Same as meas. 1 above.
- Leap R back to place, simultaneously bringing L up and behind R (ct 1); Step back onto L ft (ct 2); Rock back onto R fwd (ct &).
- 3-4 Same as Basic meas 3-4 above.

VARIANT II

- 1 Same as meas, 1 above.
- Same as meas. 2 above but perform ct 2 with twist of body to the left.
- Rock onto L, lift R up and start to swing around R (ct 1); Swing R slightly behind L (ct 2).
- 4 Stamp R down slightly behind L (ct 1); Swing L up and across R (ct 2).

SIGHANÓS

- 1 Facing R of ctr, step R fwd LOD (ct 1); Swing L up and fwd (ct 2)
- 2 Step L diag fwd (ct 1); (pivoting to face ctr), Swing R fwd (ct 2).
- 3 Step R back (ct 1); Swing L up and slightly back (ct 2).
- 4 Step L slightly L (ct 1); Swing R up and across L (ct 2)

NOTE: The swings can be substituted for a touch step anytime.
