PONIEWIERANY (Poland)

Poniewierany (poh-nyeh-vyeh-RAH-nih) is a progressive dance from the region of Wielkopolska. The dance name is derived from the verb "poniewierac" - to ill-treat someone. The dance is also known as "Puszczany" (push-CHAH-nih) from the verb "puszczac" - to set someone going. Poniewierany was taught by Jacek and Bozena Marek at the 1988 University of the Pacific Folk Dance Camp.

RECORD:

Dances of Poland by J. and B. Marek Side B/7

2/4 meter

FORMATION:

Cpls in a circle facing ptr about 1 ft apart. M arms are free. W L fist or hand (fingers fwd) is on her L hip, elbow slightly fwd. W usually holds a handkerchief with which she fans herself, using wrist action, holding it a few inches from her breast, elbow down. If no handkerchief is held, place R hand on R hip.

STEPS and STYLING:

Polka (1 to a meas): May be danced in any direction. Step on L in desired direction (ct 1); step on R near L (ct &); step on L (ct 2). Step may also beg with R ft. Step alternates. The polka is flat (no preliminary hop), danced on the whole ft with slightly bent knees. Styling for M is heavy and down to earth. When not dancing with a ptr, the third step (ct 2) for the M is accented by stamping. The W does a deeper bending of the knees on ct 2.

Okroczak (oh-KROH-chahk) - the Polish word for Pivot (2 steps per meas): Danced smoothly in shldr-shldr blade pos, stepping on the full ft. R ft is between ptr ft and L ft is outside ptr R ft. Beg M L, W R dance 2 pivot steps making 1 CW turn (cts 1,2).

Beg each Figure with M L, W R.

INTRODUCTION No action.

I. CHANGING PARTNERS

- A 1 Making 1/4 turn on first step to face LOD (CCW), dance 1 Polka step away from ptr, M twd ctr, W away from ctr.
 - Dance 1 Polka step, returning to face ptr again.
 - 3-4 Taking shldr-shldr blade pos with ptr, make 2 CW turns moving in LOD with 4 Okroczak (pivot) steps.
 - 5 Repeat meas 1.

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- Repeat meas 2 but progress to a new ptr: M move twd W behind orig ptr; W move diag fwd to meet M ahead.
- 7-8 Repeat meas 3-4 with new ptr (Okroczak in LOD).
- B 9-16 Repeat meas 5-8 two more times changing ptrs each time.
 - II. POLKA FORWARD AND OKROCZAK
 No change of ptr during this Figure.
- C 1-2 With the ptr of Fig I, meas 16, take open ballroom pos with free hand (M L, W R) holding ptr free arm just below elbow. Hold joined arms fwd away from body. Dance 2 Polka steps fwd in LOD.
 - 3-4 In shldr-shldr blade pos, repeat Fig I, meas 3-4 (Okroczak in LOD).
 - 5-16 Repeat meas 1-4 three times.
- Repeat dance from beginning, changing ptrs each time in Fig I (on meas 1-2, 5-6, 9-10, 13-14).

NOTE: In 1977 Ada and Jaś Dziewanowski also taught a version of Poniewierany (ZM 46729) which is basically the same as the one described here except that Fig II is only 8 meas long instead of 16 meas. Dancers should know which recording is being played.

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
