A. Arrhythmic Introduction - (ending with a definite pause.) There is then an 8-measure section of drums alone (very hard to pick up the basic meter), followed by an 8-measure section with drums and guitar (a little easier to follow). I advocate waiting these out, and starting to dance when the full orchestra comes in, and the rhythm is easily heard.

B. Travelling. (Start on R, in LOD.)

Right-left, right-left; (Vigorous steps)

Note: Michael's phrasing of the transition from meas 2 to meas 3 differs a bit from that of the multi-authored writeup he provided. He uses almost the full AA of meas 2 on the 4th walking step, and steals time for the quick R step (the "a" of his patter) from the G of meas 3. He dances the "a" almost on the edge between meas 2 and meas 3.

## C. Hop and Weave.

- (5-6) Step (L to L, facing COH)-hop(on L)-step(on R behind L),
  (G A A)
  Step (L to L, facing COH)-hop(on L)-swing (R around behind L, keeping it in the air);
  (G A A)
- (7-8) Step(on R behind L)-step(on L behind R)-step(on R behind L),
  (G A A)
  Step (L to COH)-lift(R in front of L shin)-hold (R in air);
  (G A A)
  (The steps of measure 7 are almost displacment steps. As one foot comes down, the other swings out to its side and starts circling back.)
