

SET DE FORTIERVILLE

(Québec - Canada)

This is a very popular type of set-mixer type of dance in Southern and Eastern Quebec. This version comes from Fortierville, a small town in the Beauce region. Learned from Richard Turcotte.

Music: Yves Moreau CD
Rhythm: 2/4
Formation: Five to 8 cpls in a small circle. W on M's R

Measure *	Pattern
1-2	All join hands and walk fwd R-L-R-touch and reverse
3	Repeat action of meas 1
4	M place W in ctr with backs to ctr, facing out. M take four steps bkwd and face CW to start walking.
5-8	While W are in ctr, M walk around CW as many steps as necessary to come back to place facing ptr.
9	M and W meet taking following hand hold: R in R (over) and L in L (under). M take two steps bkwd, facing R of ctr
10-12	M keep pulling W as in meas 9 and travel CW (M walk bkwd and W fwd)
13-16	M turn W to end up in "Varsovianna" pos (without letting go of hands) and then promenade CCW
17-24	W leave their ptr and walk fwd to next M, while M turn CW, face new partner behind and then swing her
25-32	All promenade ending up in big circle all joining hands.
	Repeat dance from beginning

* **Note:** Number of measures can vary depending on size of set (circle) and music used.
