- SOURCE: A zwiefacher learned from folk dance groups in Munich, Bavaria. It's danced in villages and towns in the lower Bavaria area of Germany. PRONUNCIATION: S00-zer-el (s'Suserl)
- MUSIC: Record: RCA LP PjL 1-4187, mixed meter 2/4 and 3/4
Festival BZS-7904, Side 1, band 1
- FORMATION: Cpls at random in closed pos or shldr waist pos.
- STEPS: Drehers (turns) in 2/4 and 3/4 meter. Rotation is uniform: no dips, flat-footed
- D = pivot in 2/4 meter W = pivot in 3/4 meter

METER: 2/4 and 3/4
