Meeting called to order at 11:15

President's Report: Pauline addressed the problem we keep discussing; How do we make Folk Dance relevant to younger people, how do we invite new people to join? We know dancing keeps us sharp. The many teachers in our groups have relied on folk dancing for rainy days, for social interaction, for non-competitive, brain involved fun. Now that many schools have reduced or eliminated physical education time, we are seeing an increase in childhood obesity. For older people, we know that regular exercise and social interaction benefits mental health. Veterans and others with PTSD who exercise and interact regularly are better able to cope with recovery. Folk Dancing is a family friendly activity that can bring social groups together. Home schooling parents can use us as a resource. We are asked to think of ways to share how our lives are better because of dance.

Vice President's Report: Diane Baker: One Festival to be approved and it was: Westwood Spring Festival April 7, 2019 1 – 4:45, Roxbury Community Center, 471 So. Roxbury Dr., Beverly Hills, CA 90212.

This prompted discussion on the meeting to be held there. Federation will pay the \$90 for use of a room and members will do a potluck lunch.

Secretary's Report: Minutes of the last meeting were sent. Minutes of the last meeting were approved by unanimous vote.

Treasurer's Report: Mindy Belli presented a written report, including a list of highlights, to the Council. It was discussed and approved. The final version of the Treasurer's Report is attached with these minutes.

Membership Report: Bob Altman was not present. Pauline read his report. We lost two clubs and as Julith reports, some have insurance from elsewhere. Associate members have joined to support Federation, some from Northern CA. He has sent out a digital file of the updated directory. At least one member responded with a change in her address. He is encouraging advertisers to pay up. Also, anyone is welcome to help proofread the directory.

Elections: Nominating committee (Sylvia Stachura and Julith Neff) has put together a slate to be voted on. Diane Baker is nominated for President, Mindy Belli for Treasurer, Leslie Halberg for Secretary, Bob Altman for Membership. VP is still open. Vote at April meeting, install in May.

Insurance Report: Judith Neff: The insurance renewal is complete and all the certificates have been delivered. Twenty clubs renewed and most of the renewal paperwork was received even later than usual.

We lost 2 clubs this year: West L.A. Folkdancers and San Diego Vintage Dancers. We also have 5 clubs that are members and get their insurance elsewhere: Bay Osos Folk Dancers, Cabrillo Folk Dancers, Ethnic Express, Prescott Folk Dancers, and this year we have added Ventura International Folk Dancers (Valerie Daley's Group).

I don't know what the solution is for all the late paperwork, but I don't think that sending out the renewal package earlier is the solution. Anything most folks receive more than 2 weeks in advance is easy to put off till later and then totally forget about.

There were a few changes in the insurance company's system last year, and even more this year. From now on, I can do most of the paperwork on-line and just mail in the check when I am done. I was able to do this with the last 2 clubs who renewed late. I can also do this with new certificate requests and these have been getting turned around in one day. Hooray!

Historian's Report: Wen Li has photos! He is continuing to document our events and post on the Federation website where files can be found. He is looking for donations of digital frames for slide shows at upcoming festivals.

Sergeant At Arms: Ed reports that we have a quorum.

Beverly & Irwin Barr FD Camp: This report covers the period since the Federation council meeting on October 21.

The Woolsey Fire in November wreaked severe damage at Hess Kramer. They will not be open for business in 2019, so our Nov. 1-3 camp is canceled, and other plans reported at the previous meeting are on hold. Based on multiple emails exchanged with Hess Kramer personnel, our \$2,000.00 deposit should be refunded, perhaps even before this council meeting, but if not, then likely no more than a week later.

The committee has researched about 20 alternate venues and will continue investigating to try to find one that meets our needs.

Fiscal, Finance Committee: Two meetings on scholarships will be held. Times will be announced.

Evaluating Visiting Master Teacher Program: Only two clubs have taken advantage of this program so far, which puts the Federation in the position of supporting only two clubs. This would be a good boost for smaller clubs, encouraging membership, raising visibility in the community.

Folk Dance Scene: No report. Deadline always on 10th of the month for submission of events and advertising. Dick Oakes (article on membership "Why Belong?")(to get people traffic to our website?).

Scholarship Committee: Carl Piltsiker is taking over. Updated nomination forms are available. Rules are on the back. Forms can be mailed or emailed to Pauline Klak. The committee includes Valerie Day, Marcella Lawson, Pauline & Ed Klak, Rick & Lynn Bingle. Recipients Lil Herr, Sylvia Mehr-Assa, Monica Zordich and Larisa Komogor, who were awarded scholarships to the Beverly and Irwin Barr Camp at Hess-Kramer for 2018, were informed that they will need to re-apply for interim Barr Camp or another camp of their choice in 2019. Forms are updated for 2019.

Equipment Report: Gordon Wall: There are 2 speakers & speaker stands, 2 new mics. Some equipment may be used for Statewide. Marshall Cates has CDs of tapes & sylabi in digital storage. Some concern over location of 2 cameras, 2 laptops that were stored at the Barr's, Georgina Shaw also moved, had some items stored. Gordon reports he has a color printer that was part of Federation inventory.
