Valerie Daley asks if the council would like Ventura to organize a Spring Fest in April 2023 to take place in Somis.

Discussed - maybe not needed with festivals in March and May already scheduled. Question of why council approves festivals - some discussion, no action.

Mindy moved to support the festival in somis if date available, carol smith 2nd. Discussion - 2 types of support - club puts on festival with possible financial help from Federation or Federation puts on and funds the festival. Motion withdrawn and rephrased. *Motion by Mindy for Council to approve a festival sponsored by Ventura Folk Dancers in Somis in spring with up to \$200 financial support from Federation. 2nd by Carol. Nobody opposed.*

Discussion of what if Ventura Folk Dancers decide not to sponsor the festival - And so....

Moved by Mindy, 2nd by Terry to hold spring festival in Somis if facility is available, Federation to be sponsor if Ventura Folk Dancers will not.

Discussion - concern due to financial and other obligations of Statewide. Supporting statements: dancers like to have fun and Federation has enough

money to support a Spring Fest in April. Vote - favor 7, opposed 4

Fall Camp Report by Marc Rayman

This report covers the time since the Federation council meeting on August 28, 2022.

Steve Kotansky withdrew on Sept. 14 for personal reasons. As last year, we had already arranged for a backup teacher. Therefore, we announced to campers that Ahmet Lüleci was replacing him. (One camper canceled as a result.)

After careful assessment of the latest science, we announced on Sept. 17 that all campers need to have a COVID-19 booster (the original or the new bivalent) between June 13 and November 1, 2022. We know of a number of campers who got their booster as a result or got it sooner than they otherwise would have, and we know of at least four who would have registered but did not because they did not want to get a booster.

We published our final, detailed COVID-19/long COVID policy on Oct. 12. We had waited until camp was close enough that we could make reasonable projections about the course of the pandemic. Many campers emailed appreciation.

Fall Camp registration closed on Oct. 23 with 59 campers plus Roberto Bagnoli and Ahmet Lüleci.

We could write lots more for this report, but we need to get back to Fall Camp preparations. To find out how camp went, either attend or read the final report at the next Federation council meeting.

Concert - Bata is inquiring among Serbian churches in So Cal to determine if he should bring a youth ensemble of up to 20 dancers for concert at festival.

Accommodations - Studio 6 selected to be the host motel. 3.1 miles from Wigwam Hall, more economical than the Doubletree Inn. <u>added at meeting:</u> <u>maybe \$160/night price not available until November</u>

Parking – still in negotiations The City of LA astronomically increased parking fees to use the Pt. Fermin Overflow parking lot which is 2 blocks from festival site. We have applied to the Port of Los Angeles for a permit to use a well lit parking lot. Will need to organize a shuttle from motel and from parking lot.

Optional cultural, historical & social activities - Friday and Sunday afternoons Details being finalized... crafts, maritime history, beer, harbor cruise

T shirts - Elyse Ellinger created, proposal has been submitted to Calimucho printing in San Pedro. awaiting estimate of costs.

Report from Solvang Folk Dancers 10-30-22 - David Heald

We have been dancing continuously since June of 2019. Initially we were dancing on our patio including during the winter of 2019-2020, until the Buellton Rec Center opened up again in April of 2020 when we switched to there, and have been dancing there since. Through the

remainder of 2020 and since there has been a very large amount of Solvang tourism. Danish Days occurred in the past on the Third Weekend of September, but was cancelled for 2020 and 2021. It was supposed to occur in 2021 but was cancelled at the last minute, but we had asked Solvang if they would object to our dancing on the street that weekend anyway, and received a very enthusiastic positive response. So even though Danish Days was cancelled that year, we danced on the street anyway, joined by quite a few couples that came down from Fresno. Danish Days was fully on this year and we had a wonderful time with probably around 50 dancers, dancing Friday night, all day Saturday and Sunday. A lot of people attended from out of town, but I would be hard pressed to say generally if tourism was greater during the September / October. It has been significant for quite some time now.

Solvang is about a 2 hour drive from LA depending on where in LA people start from. Here in the Santa Ynez Valley, Buellton where we dance, is about 10 minutes from Solvang, maybe 20 from Santa Ynez, about 30 minutes from Lompoc, and 45 minutes from Goleta, near Santa Barbara. We dance Saturday evenings from 6:00 to 8:00 PM at the Buellton Rec Center, 301 Second St. in Buellton, Room A. (From 101, exit at Buellton, Hwy 246, and head west towards Lompoc, cross Avenue of the Flags and through the next signal at Industrial Way. Turn right at the next block, La Lata to the stop sign at Second, but don't turn there. Continue straight ahead and then ½ block turn left into the parking lot. Room A is immediately adjacent to the parking lot. We do primarily International Folk Dancing, mix of line dances and couple dances. Don't need a partner. Lots of teaching, depending on the mix of people there. Evening is free! Nice floor. Very friendly group. Following dancing there is coffee and goodies. We would enthusiastically encourage anyone to join us. David

Minutes -- format & purpose report by Mindy regarding CA requirements

We comply. State says: A corporation is required (under Corporations Code § 1500) to keep adequate and correct written minutes of shareholder and board of directors proceedings.

And the state does not define those terms. And there's no distinction between corporations and nonprofit.

New Business

Have only 1 signer on checking account now. We need more. Mindy recommends Diane. Marshall said there are rules by the fiscal committee. Probably president, vp, treasurer on the main account. Marshall will check bylaws/standing rules for signature rules. Marshall will notify the potential signers and paperwork will be sent to them. Statewide did not normally have a separate account for previous festivals if the treasurer for the Federation also served as Statewide Committee treasurer. Formation of nominating committee need 5 volunteers to nominate a slate of officers for 2023, and to fill vacant positions. Need Secretary, publicity and Scholarship.

Carol Smith volunteered and was accepted to be scholarship committee chairperson. She will contact others to be on the committee.

Banner to display at festivals with fed logo, and something like international, folk dancing, public welcome etc. About 10' long. Can have one printed and shipped for \$100.

Jan moved to allocate \$100 to create and print a banner, 2nd by Terry. Marshall said fed has an 8' banner that says folk dancing. Currently Ann Armstrong has it. Vote was Favor 10, undecided 1, opposed 2)
