

#### TEACHING THIS MONTH

Although the accent will be on sheer enjoyment, the underlying reason for this effort is the continuing necessity to save the Mendocino Woodlands which houses the folklore (and other) camps. If the lease is lost, the forest will be turned over to the loggers. All monies received on Saturday, Dec. 14, will go into the Mendocino fund.

Friday night will have registration for those who haven't already pre-registered (and these may pick up their kits at that time) at headquarters, the Vandenberg Inn, 5-7 p.m. A pre-party festival follows at 8 in Veterans' Hall. Saturday the action moves to the Convention Center where the Institute will be held, 1:30-4:30 p.m. The evening festival will run from 8 to 11:30, and an afterparty follows until around 3 a.m. Sunday morning, the installation brunch will be at headquarters, 10:30-12:30. 




