

FOLK DANCE CAMPS

Almost anyone who has been dancing any length of time has been to a folk dance camp. An intensive weekend or week where we shed all other cares (including eating and sleeping) for the pure joy of dancing 8 (or 10 or 12 or 20) hours a day.

Camps have the top national teachers, often our only opportunity to see them each year. And the crop of friends we make one year usually turn up again the next.

Since most camps take place between June and September, we thought this would be an appropriate time to get our readers to think about the camps they might want to attend this summer. And there are a lot to choose from. So we have compiled this directory of information on camps taking place this year, not only here, but in Canada and England as well. There are others that we were unable to get any information on, but most California camps were included.

Each listing indicates location, dates, cost, teaching staff, living and dance facilities, special events and regular activities, and unique features of the camp. The dual number in the upper right corner of each listing (100/90) is the capacity of the camp/the average number of participants.

So pick your favorite teachers, send in for a flyer from the camp of your choice and begin thinking of what you will pack and how you will get there. Because when you do arrive on the first day, you won't want to think about anything but the morning classes, the lamb roast, talent show, or late night afterparties.

Our Food Editor, Gloria Harris, gives us a wonderful quiche recipe with an ingredient you wouldn't expect to find there. Then there are book reviews, information, and a number of important events in the Calendar section.





SPINACH AND PISTACHIO QUICHE

6 eggs	2 t salt
1 C ricotta cheese	1 1/2 t fresh chopped dill OR
2 C whipping cream	1 t dried dill
1 C grated Swiss cheese	1/2 t white pepper
2 T grated Parmesan cheese	1/2 t sugar
1 1/2 C cooked chopped spinach	grated provolone & Swiss chs
1/2 C shelled chopped pistachios	mixed about 1 C for top

Prick all over, and bak a 10" pie shell for 7 min. in 400° oven. Remove. Reduce oven to 350°
Mix all ingredients in large bowl, except the 1 cup mixed cheeses for the topping. Pour into the partially baked pie shell and bil til firm, 45-55 minutes. Top with the mixed grated cheese and sprinkle with some paprika. Return to oven til cheese melts.

brought the noodle kugel? it's absolutely superb...can I have the recipe? Me too! Want to share a tea bag? Save the plastic silverware folks.

It was indeed a first-rate brunch, the excellence of the food and drink surpassed only by the pleasant conversation (and jokes, some that I had NOT heard before) of our friends. 

REVIEWS

THE KENTUCKY SHAKERS by Julia Neal; The University Press of Kentucky; Lexington KY 40506, \$9.50

This small book is a fascinating example of the kind of cultural history we need more of. It is a history of a small group of Shakers in Kentucky. The Shakers were an odd and fascinating religious group that started in the 1700's and lasted only 'til the early 1900's, but in their prime accomplished some great things.

They believed in and practiced equality of the sexes, held all property in common, believed in ecstatic worship, and while they didn't enforce it, they encouraged celibacy. They believed that each person should labor with his own hands for the community, and to this day Shaker handicrafts, furniture, etc., is prized. Their work was always practical, but usually artistic as well.

Ms. Neal has used personal diaries as well as official records to help give us the "feel" of everyday life among this sect.

The book covers only about 100 years, from the first enthusiastic converts in 1805 to the sad decline at the end of the century. It is a moving chronicle. I enjoyed it. I recommend it.



People, Places, Things

From our readers, a sampling of reader responses on our last couple of issues.

STEVE DAVIS from Nichevo in Santa Barbara recently returned from Japan and gave us a detailed account of doings there (it is printed in its entirety in February's LET'S DANCE). It seems to be a going concern there--a Japanese Folk Dance Federation, Balkan clubs, monthly festivals, even a Japanese Scottish Highland Games. And attendance is high.

RAE TAUBER, who teaches dance teachers down in San Diego, sent us a handout she uses in teaching seminars. It ends "Know your material and your students will have confidence in you. Teach with assurance. Enjoy what you are doing and they will have a good time as well, which is really why you are all there."

DOROTHY GIRACI wanted to amplify on Lila Aurich's February remark that few Mexican dances are in the Federation repertoire. While she lists 30 dances that have been taught in local Federation clubs, only 4 of them (Corrido, Santa Rita, Tehuantepec, and Caballito Blanco) are regularly done, and only one of those appeared on the February or March Federation festival programs. She does agree with Lila that our collective repertoire contains almost nothing else from South or Central America.

NANCY MILLIGAN of the Cal Tech dancers recently returned from a stint in Wyoming. She was fortunate enough to end up in Laramie, where one of the two state folk dance clubs are located. The club's organizer was also a Pasadena emigrant, and the club (called the Snowy Rangers) not only served as a recreational club, but filled in whenever ethnic dancers were required in Laramie--like the Elizabethan Fair, Round Up Days, or the local supermarket's international festival. New dancers were drawn out of the university in Laramie. Sometimes we take the extensive nature of our network here for granted.

We have also been in touch with our Welsh correspondent, Sue Clark, founder member of the Newport International Folk Dance Group in Newport, Wales and editor of their FOLK REVIEW news bulletin. Unfortunately, their news is less happy--the group is close to folding. But she would be happy to have visitors from the US, if any of you ever go her way : 31 East Grove Road, Newport, Gwent, UK NPT 9QH.

And if you're really serious about teacher training, you can combine it with a trip to Toronto for the folk dance teacher's training course sponsored by the Ontario Folk Dance Teachers Association, the Toronto Jewish Community Centre, and the University of Toronto. The course will take place next October-December. I guess it will have to be a long trip to catch all the sessions.
