





## Letters to the Editor\_\_\_\_

Dear Editor:

This letter is in regard to the decision of the Folk Dance Federation's Statewide Committee to limit the 1987 Statewide Concert to "professional dance groups".

I do not agree with this particular decision of the Statewide Committee. Webster's defines a professional as one who "makes some activity not usually followed for gain the source of one's livelihood". I personally know of very few groups which could survive without subsidies of some sort or another. So, what constitutes a "professional" dance group? Is it one which accepts money in exchange for entertainment? In that case, almost every group with which I am familiar could fit into that category. I personally believe that the level of performance is what denotes professionalism. If this was the criterion for deciding which groups would participate in the 1987 Statewide Concert, then the Statewide Committee was exercising it's prerogatives properly.

However, I wonder if anyone considered the spirit of the phrase "folk dancers" and of "Folk Dance Federation, Statewide Concert". I've been around since dirt was new but I wasn't here when folk dancing started. It doesn't seem unlikely that the concert grew out of the local groups which comprise the Federation. The concert probably became a dance box revue where familiar individuals within the groups, of better than average commitment, talent and energy could demonstrate what they had achieved over the year. By refining the dances they did every week, they demonstrated that folk dancing was not only personally enjoyable, but could be elevated into the world of art, and be enjoyed by the general public.

The individuals within these groups (e.g. Gandys, Betyrok, Polski Isksri and others) were usually the activists who contributed more than an ego-satisfying ability to perform. They also manned the doors at Federation functions, contributed refreshments, traveled to distant locations without renumeration, and helped perform all the other tasks which were pure drudgery but necessary. In addition, their enthusiasm for folk dancing spilled over into their private lives, peopled by many novices who they brought into the Federation, through their local groups, to swell the ranks of folk dancing. In short, they gave loyalty and commitment to folk dancing and to the Federation.

Your recent decision to accept only professional groups for the Statewide performance has told them, both the existing groups and those of the past such as the Gandys and Betyrok and Polski Iskrie, and Dunaj, and others, that they are not and never were good enough to have performed professionally. I think you will find you have sacrificed a certain sense of camaraderie in so doing. I certainly would think twice before performing for an organization in which I have second class citizenship and in which an "elite" has risen.

Folk dancing, as far as I am concerned, is for everyone. The Statewide performance as I see it should be built out of the general population of folk dancers and not from groups who are rarely seen at Federation functions throughout the years. It is true that a certain level of performance should be maintained. I have no quarrel with this view. However, there is a difference between being excluded individually because a group's level of performance is not sufficiently honed and being excluded because one is not "professional". There is more to dance than technique and more is derived from dance than ego satisfaction. There is a concept of self worth, sharing, giving, and pure joy.

The Federation "folk dancers" in their totality, should be of more concern to the Federation than the realization of an "Irwin Parmes" production. The working people within your organization also need goals and heights to climb. Pay attention - think of them. Jerome Robbins said, "Dancing is that world where there are no words to express what we choreograph and hopefully dancers feel". Don't deny your membership. They deserve your loyalty.

Dear Editor:

I have really enjoyed reading all the articles about the Gypsies and have learned alot. For instance, I did not realize that they also live in the US and are so numerous here.

When, as a child, I lived in Poland in the country, I saw them and their caravans, and how they cooked their meals over open fire in the woods, and how they walked down the roads, ran into the fields to steal potatoes. I was fascinated and scared at the same time, especially that our nanny would say, "If you are not a good girl, a Gypsy woman (cyganka) will take you." Gypsy women always wanted to tell our fortunes from our hands. And then they asked to place a coin in the palm. Otherwise the good fortune will not come through. When I was 7 years old, one told me that my lucky number was 22. When I was 20, I sent to Sopot, a resort on the Baltic sea shore, where

there was a casino. My friends persuaded me to try my hand in gambling. I placed my chip on number 22 on the roulette and, believe it or not, it won!

The theme of Gypsies often appears in the Polish folklore. The recreational folk dancers of America, on one occasion or another, have done the following things with me (and my ensemble, Syrena, also performs them):

(1) danced the "Polka Cieta" from the Nowy Sacz region, which has a song, "I am a Gypsy man who has nothing but my Gypsy girl with whom I am

happy";

(2) learned the dance, Cygan (Gypsy) from the Lublin region, which has many stanzas about the Gypsy life, with a refrain, "Although we are cold and hungry we lead a free

life"; and,

(3) sung with me a romantic Gypsy song, "Hej tam pod lasem...", in which one stanza says, "A Gypsy does not have any land, a Gypsy does not have a house, but a Gypsy is free, a Gypsy is rich." Anoth-

er stanza says, "Lass, do not love either a peasant, or a landlord, but with all your heart, love a Gypsy."

In some elegant Polish restaurants before the War, Gypsy orchestras entertained the guests. In my recent travels to Poland, I visited a Gypsy settlement. I was told that they are not allowed to lead their nomadic way of life, as the Government wants to assure education and medical help for their children. However, they satisfy their longing for life in the wilderness through specially organized camping trips. They earn their living producing metal utensils, like kettles and frying pans, and through telling fortunes. They also have their performing ensembles which participate in Polish folk festivals.

May I take this opportunity (which I wanted to do for some time) to congratulate Folk Dance Scene on its progress: the beautiful format, the excellent paper, interesting articles, etc., etc. The level of the Magazine is very high now! With best wishes,

BALKAN MUSIC & DANCE WORKSHOPS

Buffalo Gap Camp, W. Va. July 17-26, 1987 Mendocino Woodlands, Ca. Aug 21-30, 1987

For many years, the East European Folklife Center has been sponsoring 9-day workshops in the folk music and dance of Bulgaria, Greece, Yugoslavia, Romania and Albania. The program includes daily dance classes, dancing to live music every evening, instruction on traditional instruments, ensemble coaching and jam sessions, singing workshops, group sings, concerts, comfortable accommodations and delicious food.

Dance teachers are Dick Crum (Balkan), Joe Kaloyanides Graziosi (Greek) and Jaap Leegwater (Bulgarian).

Instruments are provided for full-time participants who do not have their own. The music staff includes teachers of tupan, kaval, strings, clarinet, bouzouki, accordion, santouri, and several other traditional musical instruments.

Village songs are taught in men's and women's classes on various levels.

NEAR EASTERN MUSIC & DANCE WORKSHOP

Mendocino Woodlands, CA August 15-21, 1987

The program in this six-day event includes daily dance classes, dancing to live music every evening, instruction on traditional instruments, ensemble coaching and jam sessions, singing workshops, and concerts.

There will be four teachers of traditional folklore dances from Turkey (Eyup Culha), Greece (Joe Kaloyanides Graziosi), Armenia (Susan Lind-Sinanian) and North Africa or Morocco (Carolina Varga Dinicu).

Nine musicians will give workshops and performances in Turkish, Armenian, Greek and Arabic musical styles and will play for wild dance parties every evening.

Most folk dancers are aware of the various folk dance camps and workshops held each summer. But, why is the Idyllwild Folk Dance Camp so rarely mentioned?

For years the larger camps took the spotlight, while Idyllwild was kept small, at a maximum of 100.

In recent years, under the leadership of our largely new committee that's shown its willingness to experiment and take chances, Idyllwild has become such an exciting week of fun and dance that it's time the secret is exposed.

Now at last YOU can find out. Idyllwild is always held the first available week after school lets out in June. This year's dates are" June 19-26, 1987 - Friday thru Friday. One option for people who cannot get the week off is to come for the first 3 days of camp, Friday evening thru Sunday.

All dancing, parties and other activities are in a beautiful light and airy building with a GREAT wooden floor. Accommodations are all 2 to a room in either private rooms with private bath, or in dorms with separate rooms and communal bath and toilet facilities. Last year, Idyllwild was the first camp to introduce Nicolaas Hilferink to the West Coast. "Nico" teaches Romanian dance, having spent a lot of time on study and research in Romania. He was such a success last summer that we have invited him back again this year with a promise of lots of new material.

Bora Ozkok, internationally known Turkish dance teacher, will be teaching new dances from recent research trips to Turkey. His enthusiasm is infectious...we'll probably all be Turks by the end of the week!

Hungarian dancing has recent become the rage among advanced folk dancers, and we have found the perfect person to teach it: Tibor Toghia, the leader of Karpatok, the best Hungarian Folk Ensemble in this country.

Finally, our own Dick Oakes will be reteaching some great dances from former folk dance camps and institutes, in his own inimitable style.

Of course, just breathing the mountain air and walking thru the pine trees is wonderful, but one of the best things about Idyllwild is the fact that all campers share a common experience; only one class or activity is happening at any particular time, and by the end of the week, we really get to know each other.

Our afterparties are run by Sherry Cochran, who juggles requests so expertly that she justly deserves the nickname, "Best in the West;" and the intimate atmosphere we're able to create tops off the evening with the feeling that you've

been dancing at a folk dance coffeehouse.

The committee recognizes that with all the dancing, your stay at Idyllwild is really your vacation too, so we've arranged for a bit more leisure time this year for those who want to swim, or shop, or just lie down. But, just in case you want more to do, we have planned some optional activities for that time too, like a costume workshop, clogging class, learning words and singing to the dances we do, a nature walk, and Strigaturi (Romanian shouts).

So, there you have it. The secret is out! We admit, of course, that we are prejudiced, so why not judge for yourself? Try it...you'll like it!






