Surfside Statewide Teachers



Iliana Bozhanova is a native of Galabovo, Bulgaria, and comes from a family of South Thracian musicians and singers. She was born in 1961. In 1981, Iliana graduated from the National School for Art Instructors. She completed her Bachelors and Masters Degrees in Bulgarian Folk Dances and Choreography in Plovdiv at the Academy of Music and Dance

Art, the oldest in the Balkans and the most prestigeous Folk Art Academy in Bulgaria.

Since her childhood, Iliana has been a member of Folk Dance Ensemble **Râčenica** in Plovdiv with Artistic Director Dimitar Doichinov. Râčenica, which was formed in 1949, gave her unforgettable opportunities to introduce folk art during many performances in Bulgaria and International Dance Festivals in Belgium, France, Greece, Holland, Italy, Poland, Portugal, Russia, and Serbia. Iliana says she will never forget the wonderful people from Râčenica and the fact that with the Ensemble she made her first steps as a dance teacher!

In 1981, Iliana became the Choreographer and Artistic Director of two children's folk dance ensembles: **Radost** from the village of Loakim Gruevo, and **Roza Dimitrova's Orphanage Kids**. For these children she made her first choreography and introduced the ensembles in the Festival for Amateur Folk Art in Plovdiv. Besides her work as a dance teacher and choreographer, Iliana works as a Technician of Architecture and Civil engineering. She is married and has two sons.

Since 1995, Iliana has worked with the **Bosilek** Bulgarian Folk Dance Ensemble in New York with Artistic Director Cathie Springer. Iliana created 10 dances for the Ensemble: *Enyovden, Pirinska miluvka, Babini unuki, Haide bulki na pazar, Shopski tants, Varnenski tants, Maimari,Byalo zeleno cherveno, Peperuda v Dobrudzha,* and *Na firuglitsa*. She used folk dance materials from all over Bulgaria. Ensemble Bosilek and Cathie Springer gave her the unique opportunities to create, develop, share, and enjoy the richness of Bulgarian Folklore

Iliana also has taught in the United States at several folk dance camps, including Mendocino and Ramblewood Balkan Camps (1996, 1997, 1998); Folklore Dance Camp, Mendocino, California (1998); Pinewoods Dance Camp, Massachusetts (2001); Mainewoods Dance Camp, Maine (1998 and 2002); and Stockton Folk Dance Camp, Stockton, California (2001 and 2002). In addition, Iliana has taught Bulgarian Folk Dances in Holland (1995 and 2002) and Norway (1999).

As a lecturer, Iliana has introduced Bulgarian Folk Art at several universities in California, including UCLA in Los Angeles (1997); UCSD at San Diego (1997); UCSB at Santa Barbara (2001); University of the Pacific in Stockton (2001 and 2002); California University of Art in San Fernando (2000). She also taught at Eastman University in Rochester, New York (1998 and 2000); as well as at several High Schools in Rochester, New York; Yakima, Washington, and in Vermont.



Andy Taylor-Blenis is the daughter of Marianne and Conny Taylor, cofounders of the Folk Arts Center of New England. She began international folk dancing as a young child.

Marianne Taylor taught Portuguese dances at Stockton Camp and Andy continues her work of

reconstructing Portuguese dances.

Andy was certified in Scottish Country Dance at age 17. She is a graduate of the University of Massachusetts at Amhurst with a BFA in dance and minor in Social Anthropology.

Andy teaches international dance through the Folk Arts Center of New England, Revels Inc., and Mass Movement as well as in private and public schools and universities.

In 2006, Andy founded and is the artistic director of **Mladost Folk Ensemble** in honor of her father, Conny Taylor. Andy is also currently artistic director for the RSCDS Demonstration Team and the Wheaton College Dance Group in Norton, Massachusetts.

She continues to teach modern and jazz dance at the college level as well as teaching in local studios.

Dances Andy has taught include *Malhao*, *Nã Vás Ão Mar Tonho*, *Rosinha de Afife*, *Rosinha de San Lourenco*, *Ruzga de Santa Marta*, *Vira Cruzada*, *Vira da Nazará*, and *Vira do Sitio*.

Last month we featured articles from dancers on how that got started in folk dancing. Here are some more: LARRY TENDIS

It's the music and the rhythms! It's people and friendships! It's the camaraderie of being in a line dancing with others as you execute a series of intricate steps. It's the recognition that you are part of a set that needs you and your partner to complete the patterns of the dance with them for it to work! It's the feeling of being one with your partner as you master the steps and really hear the music as you dance around the floor to a hambo or pols.

There was lots of music of all kinds in our house growing up, but especially folk music. Our home stressed knowledge of our own Jewish culture and heritage as well as the importance of getting to know and understand other cultures. What better way than through food, folk music and dance?

My first memory of "dancing" is at my grandparents' house - Jewish, Russian, Romanian music on records - at age 3 or 4. I remember movement/feet swaying to rhythms - and laughing and having a good time.

I went to a Jewish secular school on Sundays where the teachers were folk dancers and taught folk dancing - Israeli (*Mayim, Lech Lamid Bar*), easy Balkan (*Ersko Kolo*) etc. as part of a multicultural/ humanistic curriculum.

At the age of 12, I went to see the Moiseyev Russian dance group and was hooked by the music, the costumes, the patterns, the men's kazatski. I remember being mesmerized by the Georgian women's dance where they wore long floor-length dresses that covered their shoes so that you could not see how the heck they were taking such quick tiny steps that made it seem like they were gliding across the floor. It was so energizing!

About the same time, I remember going to a huge arena in Long Beach where there were hundreds of people folk dancing to records. It turned out to be my first experience at a Statewide Festival!

When I got into college at UCSB in 1966, I took a PE class in folk dance (shottishe, square dance) much too elementary and not the Balkan rhythms that had turned me on as a kid. Then, I went to do general folk dancing on campus once a week - maybe 10 - 15 people - small, but taught by a very good male Balkan dancer whose name I don't remember. This is where I began to learn about styling. Summer '67 as well as winter and spring breaks, I went to the Intersection FD Cafe in LA and had a ball. Teachers Athan Karras and Rudy Dannes among others continued my exposure to all dances Balkan and emphasized styling which served me well when I transferred to UC Berkeley in 1968

At Berkeley, the UC Folkdancers met at the Old Gym Monday and Wednesday nights where upwards of 100-150 people squeezed in for a beginner/ intermediate class and 50-100 for an advanced class. I co-taught with Bora Ozkök the beg/int class for a couple of years. I got to know Sunni Bloland, who taught us Romanian dances. Berkeley is where I first met Donna Tripp and Ted Martin, who taught (or tried to teach) the International dancers the Hambo the correct way! I continued to dance at UC, at the International House, and at Ashkenaz. Once or twice a year for the last 30 years, I return to Ashkenaz

MARGE @ LARGE, REFLECTIONS AND IMPRES-SIONS

What can be better than a snowbird trip to Phoenix this time of year? Frankly, nothing could be better. Upon hearing that the Macedonian Church in Phoenix was having a special event in mid-February, we drove the 400 miles east on Interstate 10. The worst part was the rising sun just north of Palm Springs. That sun was blinding!! The only rest stop we saw in California was closed.
