It was the spring of 1978, and I was living in the dorms at UC Irvine. Up to that point, my "folk dance" experience was essentially limited to the half dozen Israeli dances I had seen at Jewish Singles events the previous couple of years. Our dorm decided to have a booth at the annual

Wayzgoose Festival (the annual spring festival in the park at the center of campus). Well, the day of the festival, the sky opened up and it poured, a warm, hard, drenching downpour. By the time we tore down the booth we were all soaked to the skin. As I walked in from the park, I heard the music for *Pata Pata* playing. When I went to investigate, I saw a bunch of wet students dancing in the rain, the record player sitting under a table, plugged into an electrical outlet that apparently grew out of a nearby tree. I joined the dance (that was the one non-Israeli dance I knew) and discovered that this wet band of happy students were the UCI Folk Dancers. The rest, as they say, is history.

The next year, the club on campus folded when the entire leadership and most of the participants graduated. Later that year I discovered folk dancing in the community (Narodni, Veselo Selo at their old home on Anaheim Blvd., Donna Tripp's group at the Long Beach JCC, Herb Offner's group at the Long Beach Unitarian Church, Pnina's Israeli group at Temple Beth Tikvah in Fullerton, Israel Yakovee's Israeli group). It was around that same time that I also met Michelle Sandler (although it took another 16 years of dating before I got around to making her my wife, but that's another story).

Along the way, Henrietta Bemis taught me the fundamentals of being an effective teacher (thank you Henrietta!), and I've enjoyed more than a few

NARODNI FOLK DANCERS

Ed's Note: Narodni is a Slavic word meaning "folk" or "people."

Narodni Folk Dancers just celebrated our 40-year anniversary in June 2016. Our website states that the "group was formed in 1976 when the California State University of Long Beach International Folkdance Club merged with the Long Beach Folk Dance Co-op." I have been a part of the club most of that time. I think that I started dancing with the group around 1979 or so. That's 37 years just for me. Henrietta Bemis has been dancing with the group since before I joined. I think that she started folk dancing around the time I was born and she is still at it. She is still active with Narodni as well as with *Veselo Selo* Folk Dancers. I remember dancing at Long Beach State College when I first began. We were at the Student Union there where we could hopefully attract new dancers from the student body. We also danced in the women's gym for a while.

From there we moved to Hill Junior High School. Back in those days, schools gave us use of the facility for free as it was considered an "educational" activity. We stayed there until they raised the rent to more than the traffic would bear. I remember dancing in that big gym with the "foot friendly" wood floor. I have many fond memories of those days where we had a door sitter and shoe inspector. Donna Senosen made sure that no one forgot to pay and that we left no black scuff marks on that wonderful floor.

It was there that I started to become a more active member of Narodni, serving first as punch chairman and then as treasurer. I remember the board meetings and the mailing parties we used to have at the home of Lucille and Chuck Vestal. We were able to plan our dance program, get our teachers lined up for 3 months, and publish a calendar flyer that was mailed out quarterly. We had mailing parties where we folded flyers, attached labels, and sorted them into areas by zip code before we took them to the post office for mailing. Wow, does that seem like ancient history!

I remember having our annual weekend at the Sierra Club's Harwood Lodge. We would haul our food and supplies up to the lodge from the lower

parking lot. The lodge was communal and everyone pitched in with the cooking and cleaning. The men's dorm had bunk beds with 2 bunks, while those in the women's dorm were 3 bunks high. Bob Brooks and his wife Chris Buck were our overseers each year. There was hiking during the day or just plain lying around and relaxing for those who did not want to dance. I remember having singing contests at the dinner table, with each table striving to sing louder than the others. And of course there was dancing until the wee hours. One of our last weekends, we had to dig our way from the parking lot to the door through 3 or 4 feet of snow.

We next moved to the Unitarian Universalist Church in Long Beach for our dancing. Many of us had our first folk dance experience there with Herb Offner who ran a group there as a Sierra Club activity so it naturally came to mind when we were looking for a new home. We were there until our seemingly eternal president, John Matthews, found us a place at the California Heights Methodist Church. We were all getting a little older and that "linoleum over cement" floor at the UU Church was bothering a lot of feet. California Heights had a nice wood floor in their auditorium and we stayed there until the church asked us to move on as they needed the room for their own ever expanding activities.

From there we moved to Downey where we found a studio with a good wooden floor. Even though we had to climb a flight of stairs to get up to the studio, we were happy to be there. We had to leave when the owner retired. We are now in Bellflower at the Bellflower Woman's Club in Simms Park (9402 Oak Street). We are happy to be dancing at an affordable, friendly place with that "foot friendly" floor that has become so important to most of us as we get older. We have a core of dancers that has been together for years, so it is like getting together with good friends.

Narodni has been active in the Folk Dance Federation of California, South as long as I have been dancing. Our members have served as committee chairs, committee members as well as Board Officers. Gordon Wall and I (Julith Neff) have served as President of the Federation and I have

been your Insurance Chairman for so many years that I can't really remember when I started. We have hosted several Federation sponsored festivals: two Beginners' Festivals many years back in Long Beach, organized by Carl Pilsecker and a couple of Summer Fests, sharing our wonderful facility with you. Our club continues to make a showing at Federation

meetings.

Narodni is a friendly group that loves any excuse to party. Come and join us on Thursday nights from 7:30 to 10:30 where you can dance, eat, or just socialize with friendly people. We always have a good time.

THE DANCERS OF CRETE

Politismos, an organization in Sacramento that has established a "virtual museum" website concerning Greek culture (ancient and modern) has just put up an exhibit of two dozen pictures with explanatory text called *The Dancers of Crete* (June-Dec. 2016). Its opening paragraph gives a good idea of the content: "Ancient Greeks so admired Cretan dancers that they believed the Cretans had invented dancing. Cretans still love to dance, and dancing the traditional dances is an important part of Cretan rural life today, especially at weddings and other festivities. The same was true a century ago, as old photos and descriptions inform us. Some traits of their dances and costumes apparently even descend from the Bronze

folk adventures. Two trips with Dunaj to perform in Eastern Europe, 14 annual excursions to Mendocino Woodlands and the Russian River for Hungarian dance camps, a week in Taiwan as an invited teacher at a folk dance camp (I taught Romanian dances), LIFE Camp, and a few times at North/South Camp. I've been involved with running the Laguna Festival for more years than I want to admit, usually in the role of Concert Chairman or Festival Chairman. Seven years dancing with Lee Otterholt in Syrtaki. And, slightly tangentially, I've gotten to play with some great folk musicians in Zimzala (international folk dance music with a seriously tongue-in-cheek twist), Madison Avenue Folk, and Hurok (Hungarian village music).

This last year I've been pretty scarce at the local folk dance clubs because my "partial" knee replacement didn't heal properly so dancing is (hopefully temporarily) not an option. I really don't want to go back under the knife for a total knee replacement, but it's looking more and more like that's what my near-term future holds for me.

I guess, like many of my compatriots, folk dancing and folk music has pretty much defined at least part of my life for the last 30 years. Guess I didn't hide well enough when The Federation came looking for someone to take over Membership now that Steve Himel has moved to the Seattle area. I'm looking forward to many more years of participating with my friends in the folk dance community.

Bill Lidicker Honored

On March 11, Suzanna Yeh and I attended an awards banquet as part of the National Folk Organization conference, which meets annually somewhere in the United States, but luckily for us, happened in Santa Clara this year. We had a special reason to go to this event: our very own Bill Lidicker was to be honored with a special award for his many contributions to the world of folk dance, not only by serving on various boards including the NFO and local and state folk dance boards, but also in his dedication to promoting folk dance, spending many hours in research and write-ups of dances, and gathering new dances to bring to the local folk dance communities. The list of contributions went on and on, and I learned a lot of new things about Bill. He maintained his usual humble and respectful demeanor, but I could tell he was glowing inside!

Beyond all the wonderful things they said about Bill at the awards banquet, for me his contribution is more immediate and personal. We were often performing partners in Westwind International Folk Ensemble and Jubilee American Dance Theatre. He was my mentor and guide as a new teacher and encouraged me through my first years at BFD. I always felt respected and valued as his teaching partner and learned so much from him about style and cultural background of our dances. Bill is still my “go-to” person when I have a question about a dance. His many years of experience are so much a part of him he doesn’t even have to look it up!

Here at Berkeley Folk Dancers, Bill has been giving since he joined in 1964: he’s held Board offices, including president; teacher at all levels for decades, often with his wife Louise (pictured below); precise Parliamentarian for as long as anyone can remember; and currently the Dance Committee chair. He’s also had a distinguished parallel career as a professor of mammalogy at UC. His selfless promotion of folk dancing for everyone is a treasure.
