A SPELL OF GOOD CHEER BEFELL CAMPERS AT FALL CAMP 2021

In a year of uncertainty, we Fall Campers certainly enjoyed ourselves meeting and chatting, learning dances, writing poetry, making art and music, gazing at stars, discovering natural surroundings, sampling Tai Chi, breaking a coronavirus-shaped pinata, and joyfully dancing the nights away November 12-14 at the Brandeis-Bardin Campus of the American Jewish University near Simi Valley. Many folks contributed to the success of Fall Camp. Directors Jan and Marc Rayman logged hours of overtime. They summarized their goals for camp and the challenges in attaining them:

"Between the two of us, we have planned and conducted many events, including Fall Camp 2019 and other dance fests, and complex technical ascents of mountains and NASA interplanetary missions! Yet planning Fall Camp 2021 was in a category of its own! Our priority was to provide a funfilled weekend while protecting the well-being of participants. Achieving that goal involved countless complications with which the faint-of-heart reader needn't be traumatized. One obvious problem for advance planning was the inherent unpredictability of the pandemic. Besides complying with fluctuating rules imposed by Ventura County, we had to conform to stringent conditions set down by Brandeis-Bardin, which, for many months, disallowed people from different households to share rooms. We planned camp to include flexibility and devised backup solutions to ensure that all the myriad pieces would fit together even if conditions changed. We wanted campers to have a rewarding experience no matter what happened, and thus were prepared when, four days before camp, Roberto Bagnoli tested positive for COVID-19, could not travel and had to withdraw. That disappointment wasn't the final hurdle. We had planned for some dancing to take place outside (where masks would not be required), and were pleased with the forecast for beautiful weather. But temperatures far exceeded predictions; campers ended up dancing during a record-breaking heat wave. With guick modifications we managed to make activities continue enjoyably. (Aaron Alpert admirably replaced Roberto and instruction took place in rooms with A/C.)

We wanted campers to focus on having a grand weekend, not on our myriad challenges. When we observed how much fun everyone was having, how happy they were to socialize, learn new dances, dance old and new favorites, and engage in other activities, our hard work was proven to be worthwhile!"

Gratitude was expressed by all who contributed to organizing and implementing Fall Camp!

Kelley O'Neil, volunteer in charge of the check-in table, observed that folks were excited to be at camp, but arrived calm and collected thanks to the thorough instructions received in advance from Marc and Jan. After checking in, folks browsed books on the "share" table and inspected items contributed for

a silent auction. Outside we conversed and enjoyed snacks before dance and music instruction began. Kelley observed, "there was a level of gratefulness just to be together that came through in everyone."



Terry Gucwa directed the "Potluck Band" and singers. He reflects: "This year's Potluck Band boasted sixteen illustrious members, all regular folk dancers at SoCal clubs. They included two musicians from Pasadena's Fifth Friday Band, two from Sans Frontiéres, one from Veselba, and a retiree from the Boston Symphony Orchestra! Naturally, even with such high-powered talent, the first rehearsal on Friday afternoon was total pandemonium (Always a good omen! Just a matter of getting that energy synchronized). After two more rehearsals, the band was ready for Saturday evening when we played for dancing. The response from dancers was gratifying. Such enthusiastic dancing! Thank you, every band participant, every dancer!"

Another activity available to campers was art making. At their leisure campers could construct a "Leaf Wreath" head piece. Jan Rayman placed instructions and materials for the hair adornments in the dance hall. Folks crafted and wore colorful headdresses which can be seen in numerous photos. The second art project—Leaf Relief-- was planned by Kasia Lisowska. Kasia describes how this project came to be at Fall Camp: "I am a teacher at a play-based preschool. Our mantra is 'Not the product is important but the process.' So, when Jan approached me to lead an engaging craft activity, this one came to mind. It is fall-themed, easy to do, with spectacular results. It was my first time to lead adults in relief

making, and turned out to be not much different than leading preschoolers. Everyone wanted to start immediately and finish as soon as possible, ha, ha, ha! So much for enjoying the process! Luckily, it worked out. I put all the instructions on a whiteboard so everyone could go ahead without my help. Thankfully. I brought an abundant supply of materials (except for spray glue which ran out) -cardboard, pressed leaves, aluminum foil, spray paint, water-based markers, hair spray. The finished art was impressive; artists' reactions, enthusiastic. Quite a few dancers told me that they would try this project with their grandchildren during the holidays. Some pieces got framed and placed on mantles in dancers' homes. The project is named 'Leaf Relief,' because the methods employed create a relief. Marc noticed a lovely ambiguity for the word 'relief,' which gave the project a new and deeper meaning."

Sonia and Cristian taught dances from their latest collection, no. 11, and also presented an enriching culture corner. Campers enjoyed their clear instructions and delightful humor. Aaron Alpert had signed up to attend Fall Camp as a participant. Prior to camp Marc contacted Aaron. Aaron recalls: "The US was severely restricting who could enter, and there was a concern that either Roberto or Sonia & Cristian would be prohibited from coming. I agreed to serve as backup but was apprehensive about subbing for these illustrious teachers. I breathed a sigh of relief when the US eased restrictions in early November. Then, three days before camp, Marc told me that Roberto had tested positive for Covid. I wasn't worried: of course. he'd recover in time! It wasn't until the week of camp that I got final confirmation. Hurriedly I wrote dance notations and filmed videos. Before I knew it. I was at camp with a bunch of friendly, smiling (behind masks) faces! Thanks to Marc and Jan for trusting me, and to all the campers for sticking with camp registration despite last-minute changes!"

Master teachers, Sonia Dion and Cristian Florescu, and Aaron Alpert taught double sessions of all their material and are still smiling. Another shout of thanks comes from Valerie Daley, who hosted Sonia & Cristian, and Canadian dancer Dale Adamson, for a few days prior to camp. Valerie shares her feelings: "I cannot compress into a few sentences my experience at Fall Camp and hosting 3 Canadians after being isolated for so long! My house is falling apart; I didn't have a functional oven. But I received the gift of hosting 3 precious people." Val recalls a verse in the Sound of Music, "Sometime in my life or childhood, I must have done something good." "I don't know if I ever did anything very good, but I keep reaping the benefits as if I did. Thank you, Marc and Jan. Amazing job!"

Camille Dull, mistress of poems, continued the accolades: "The Poetry Workshop in the quiet library with wonderfully tall windows, was rewarding and productive. The intimate group size allowed for special bonding. Driving to camp Saturday, I took pleasure in the early-morning sunlight highlighting the hills. It felt glorious to see familiar (masked) faces again. Before departing Saturday afternoon I enjoyed two teaching sessions and loved the dances. Thank you, Jan and Marc for doing it again: creating a magical Fall Camp for us!"

Mady Newfield and husband Rob Plunkett arrived from Illinois. She expressed pleasure at becoming acquainted with a friendly group of California dancers whom she had only known as "faces in boxes on Zoom." Mady commented on the camp facilities: "We hadn't realized how strikingly beautiful the camp location is and how very comfortable the accommodations would be. The beauty of dancing under the palm trees on the plaza that first evening with Cristian and Sonia really sticks with me! The attractive site and the expertly organized weekend, plus the friendliness of the other campers, made it a true delight to attend! As someone who has been running June Camp for 20 years, I appreciated the detailed information about the camp and quick responses from the organizers, especially when the situation needed to

change at the last minute! We look forward to returning to this camp on a regular basis!" Mady and Rob had added incentives to attend Fall Camp. They had toured Transylvania with Sonia & Cristian and a trip to SoCal enabled brief visits with their daughter and grandchild who live in the southland.

Thanks to party DJ volunteers, Loui Tucker, Friday evening, and Dale Adamson, Saturday evening. The request list for party dances was so extensive we could have danced for 5 nights, like the Roma at a wedding. More thanks to volunteers Mindy Belli, Shirley Hamstra, Sandy Helperin, Betsy Lewis, Therese Mahoney, Steve Waller, Chin Yu and others who helped with signs, fans, decorations and photography. Anthony Ivancich provided massages.

For all Jan & Marc's tireless labors and the contributions of many volunteers we Fall Campers sing a heartfelt "THANK YOU!"

practice dances you will lead when you return, do exercises to keep your body strong & able to dance, subscribe to Scene and stay abreast of dance events in So Cal and beyond...

Finally, if staying fit and healthy is among your goals, experts offer suggestions to assist.

Choose more than one activity as a pastime. Three might be the right number. Variety increases the likelihood you will engage in activity more minutes per week. It decreases the chance that you will develop an overuse injury. You will be less likely to become bored or fixated on logging miles, reps or weights. Choosing an activity that is social (like international recreational folk dancing) fosters mental health; including a muscle building activity promotes good posture and may prevent falls. These suggestions were published in the Washington Post July 14, 2020 in an article by Amby Burfoot.
