# The Corner

#### PRESIDENT'S COLUMN

Cheers to us—seniors are paying attention to our health and the results are notable! According to a Rand Corp. study, the percentage of people over 65 who are suffering from dementia declined by almost a third from 2000 to 2016. The study, published in the journal Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences, and summarized in UPI Health News Nov. 7. 2022, does not explore causation for the decline. Could it be that more folks are dancing, swimming. walking, playing pickle ball, etc., plus socializing and filling their plates with fruits and vegetables? Unfortunately, in 2016 8.5% of people in the US over age 65 were experiencing dementia. Friends don't let friends fade away. Pay it forward. Encourage your friends to join you at a folkdance session. When they ask, "what is folk dancing?" you won't have to stutter to describe your hobby. The Folk Arts Center of New England helpfully published a description. Read it at https://facone.org/about-whatis-folkdancing.html. Sarah Bustin, student president of the University of MA at Lowell Folk Dance Club. adapted the description in her welcome to new dancers. I thank Sarah for permission to include her message in Scene:

- A definition of International Folk Dance: Folk dances are traditional social dances of ethnic groups, rural or urban, from all over the world. Social dances are participatory dances done at weddings, parties, and other gatherings.
- •How do I start? If you are new to folk dancing, our Tuesday night dances are the perfect place to join. Beginners and singles are always welcome! Comfortable, lightweight casual clothes and nonmarking, soft-soled, low-heeled shoes are best for folk dancing.
- •What should I expect? In a typical Tuesday evening, we do many different types of folk dances. Local folk dance bands provide music one or two evenings every semester. Each week, most of our dances are taught or called, and others can be followed by watching the leading dancers.


Hats off to Marc & Jan and their volunteer assistants who organized and carried out a flawless Fall Camp 2022!

# SOLVANG



#### **REPORT FROM SOLVANG FOLK DANCERS 10-30-22**

We have been dancing continuously since June of 2020. Initially we were dancing on our patio including during the winter of 2020-2021, until the Buellton Rec Center opened up again in April of 2021 when we switched to there, and have been dancing there since. Through the remainder of 2021 and since there has been a very large amount of Solvang tourism. Danish Days occurred in the past on the Third Weekend of September, but was cancelled for 2020 and 2021. It was supposed to occur in 2021 but was cancelled at the last minute. We had asked Solvang if they would object to our dancing on the street that weekend anyway, and received a very enthusiastic positive response. So even though Danish Days was cancelled that year, we danced on the street anyway, joined by quite a few couples that came down from Fresno. Danish Days was fully on this year and we had a wonderful time with probably around 50 dancers, dancing Friday night, all day Saturday and Sunday. A lot of people attended from out of town, but I would be hard pressed to say generally if tourism was greater during September/October. It has been significant for quite some time now.

Solvang is about a 2-hour drive from LA depending on where in LA people start from. Here in the Santa Ynez Valley, Buellton, where we dance, is about 10 minutes from Solvang, maybe 20 from Santa Ynez, about 30 minutes from Lompoc, and 45 minutes from Goleta, near Santa Barbara. We dance Saturday evenings from 6:00 to 8:00 PM at the Buellton Rec Center, 301 Second St. in Buellton, Room A. (From 101, exit at Buellton, Hwy 246, and head west towards Lompoc, cross Avenue of the Flags and through the next signal at Industrial Way. Turn right at the next block, La Lata to the stop sign at Second, but don't turn there. Continue straight ahead and then ½ block turn left into the parking lot.) Room A is immediately adjacent to the parking lot. We do primarily International Folk Dancing, mix of line dances and couple dances. Don't need a partner. Lots of teaching, depending on the mix of people there. Evening is free! Nice floor. Very friendly group. Following dancing there is coffee and goodies. We would enthusiastically encourage anyone to join us.

In addition to the great dancing, the Santa Ynez Valley is beautiful and a great place to visit, wineries, wonderful mountains for hiking, and very friendly people. On the third Saturday of the month, we dance in Downtown Solvang from 1:00 to 3:00 and invite people in the audience to join us. As a result, there are fewer dancers for our session in Buellton on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturdays of the month.

The photo on the next page was taken of our group dancing in Downtown Solvang, earlier in October. We were joined by two other couples, one from Santa Barbara and one from Pasadena. My wife, Jo, and I danced with the Santa Barbara couple at the Santa Barbara English Country dance group, but which has not been dancing because of the virus. I am the one with the beard, and Jo is next to me in the red vest.

# DANCERS SPEAK

#### **SQUARE DANCING**

Diane Baker, our effervescent Folk Dance Federation, South president has told us (November Scene) of her early involvement in square dancing. That prompted me to call up memories of my square dancing days.

At church young people conventions, when I was a teen, simple square dancing was often part of the program. No instruction, just try to figure out what the caller was telling you to do. Lots of giddy fun.

After graduating from college I left my Boston home and went to work in Akron, Ohio. Akron home was a room on the 13th floor of the YMCA. Every Wednesday night, in the large first floor assembly room there was a square dance, led by a member of the Y staff. Dozens of young, energetic Akronites danced enthusiastically. I quickly became an every Wednesday enthusiast.

One night the leader/caller asked if I would like to call a dance. Sure. I had been dancing long enough by then to know the calls for quite a few dances. Thereafter I occasionally called or sang the do-si-dos. We had a professional caller one night and, when he took a break, I called a dance or two.

Several weeks later my church centered social group decided it would be fun to zip over to Canton, about 25 miles away, on a Saturday night to participate in the Pro Caller's large outdoor square dance. Held in the massive parking lot of a major manufacturing company, it featured live music. We found dancers from all over the local area, maybe a hundred or more.

Pro Caller called several lively dances. Then he said: "There's a young fella here from Akron tonight." He seemed to be looking in my direction. "I'd like to have him come up on stage and call a dance for us." Yes, he meant me! I jumped at the chance and went to the stage.

"What would you like to call?"

"How about Glory, Glory, Hallelujah?" It was a singing call.

"Great."

Sets formed. The band began to play. I started the call. The parking lot came to life.

"The first lady promenade the inside of the ring,

"When you get back home give your partner a great big swing ..." The pinnacle of my calling career.

Not long afterward there was a period when Life didn't offer the chance for dancing. But then, during a summer spent working on the trail crew at Mount Rainier National Park, I experienced an entrancing weekend in the little mountain town of Enumclaw where the Glacier Gliders were hosting a folk dance festival. There was dancing in the high school gym (the Hambo looked easy), dancing in the town streets, dancing in the park that seemed like a fun sister of square dancing.

Fast forward a few years. Mary and I and our three daughters had settled in Lakewood, California. A neighbor spoke of belonging to a square dance club and invited us to attend a session. Why not? We had had some sporadic opportunities to square dance in Ohio before we moved to California and were confident we could pick it up again quickly. To our surprise we discovered that Western Square Dance was different from Eastern Square Dance - more complicated with all the couples often moving simultaneously - in contrast to East's reliance on active/inactive couples. We would need lessons if we were to continue and that wasn't feasible.

About that time we read in the local paper about something called the Statewide Folk Dance Festival that was soon to be held in Long Beach. We attended several sessions. BIG WOW! That settled our dancing focus for the forthcoming decades.

Square dancing has popped back into the picture twice since then: I choreographed a square dance for an Oasis on Stage performance and created a dance for eight members of the Bellflower Civic Chorus to whoop and holler to as the rest of the Chorus sang Wabash Cannonball during its three Fall 2006 concerts. Yee Haw!


