Featured Artists

Sonia Dion and Cristian Florescu, Romanian Folk Dance

Cristian Florescu was born in Bucharest. Romania. He started dancing in 1982 with different Romanian folk ensembles, and studied with various specialists including the renowned, Theodor Vasilescu. Cristian was principal dancer with the National Ensemble Cununa Carpatilor with whom he toured extensively in Europe, Asia and North America. In 1990-91, the Romanian Ministry of Culture, and the Folklore Choreographers Association of Romania, awarded him a certificate, recognizing him as a solo dancer and choreographer in the field of folklore. He also was chief répétiteur for the Folk Ensemble Balada in Romania and worked as choreographer for the Academic Ensemble Joc in Moldova. In 1993, he joined Les Sortilèges, a professional folk dance company based in Montreal with whom he was actively involved as a dancer, teacher, répétiteur and choreographer until 2003. Since coming to Canada. Cristian has acquired multiple skills in various dance forms including modern dance, ballroom, jazz, tap as well as French-Canadian clogging and Irish step dancing.

Sonia Dion was born in Québec and has been a professional dancer for over 20 years. She was lead dancer and choreographer for Les Sortilèges dance company, Canada's oldest professional folk dance ensemble, with whom she developed several new productions including *Une page d'histoire, un pas de danse, Montréal en danse, and Pour se faire plaisir.* Sonia has toured worldwide and has been exposed to a wide range of dance techniques including Romanian folk dance, Scottish highland dancing, French-Canadian clogging and ballroom.

Cristian and Sonia have been guest performers with the Collage International Dance Ensemble of Boston, have been regular teachers at l' École supérieure de danse du Québec and have been selected to be part of the Artists in the Schools program sponsored by the Québec Ministry of Education. In recent years, they have developed a specific interest in working with recreational folk dance groups in Canada and the United States, Mexico and Brazil. They have been teaching in Europe (Austria, England, Poland, Germany, Italy, Norway, Belgium, Switzerland, The Netherlands, France) in Asia (Taiwan, Hong Kong, Japan, Singapore, Malaysia) and Australia to share their love of Romanian folk traditions.

Asya Gorska

Asya Gorska is a Ukrainian-born artist. She is a choreographer and singer. As a singer she performs a variety of musical styles in different languages. She is also a social worker, a volunteer and a community activist.

Asya has almost 25 years of dance experience in various dance forms, such as: folk stage, ballet, Bailey dance, modern and ballroom dance. For the past 12 years, Asya has been the Art director and choreographer of the Ukrainian ensemble "Chervona Kalyna" which was founded in Los Angeles in 1997. Their main goal is to preserve, educate and convey to the modern generation of Ukrainians in America: the history, culture, features and regional origin of Ukrainian dance.

Another mission of the ensemble is to introduce and popularize Ukrainian culture and traditions among Americans and immigrants from other countries. In addition, "Chervona Kalyna" actively participates in various international festivals and concerts and in many charity events supporting Ukrainians in this challenging time.

COSTUME CORNER

SLOVAKIA

One of the most dazzling costumes from Central Europe is that of Catholic women from the area around Piešt'any in western Slovakia. With full and densely embroidered sleeves and an ornate ruff for a collar, the blouse in particular shows its Baroque and Renaissance heritage—a flamboyant heritage which the Catholic communities emphasized all the more, even as their Protestant neighbors darkened and simplified their own costumes to make an opposing religious statement. (People married across ethnic lines, but not across religious ones.)

Decades ago, I was lucky to find one of these masterpieces of stitchery in a tumbled heap in a shop. The blouse was collarless, and the drawstrings gathering the heavy white linen fabric to the neck (a typical Central European design) were coming undone, but the richly embroidered sleeves were still perfect. My husband chased me away and bought it for me. Eventually I found time to rework the raveling neck and—after much consultation with pictures—create for it a rather simple new ruff. But the sleeves are still its glory, from shoulders to flaring wrists.

The entire sleeve and matching cap would be decorated in cutwork, each tiny cut-out circle within the bigger design being bound off with bright orange or yellow thread, leaf-shapes being satin-stitched in between. In the 19th century, rich women actually used thread of gold, while those of lesser means employed shiny yellow silk, and the poorest used bright yellow and orange cotton. But whatever the thread, the needlework was exguisite and the effect similar. In 1895, the Izabella Society was set up to facilitate workshops throughout the area to make these cutwork blouses for sale to the many visitors to local spas. I suspect mine. done in cotton. was one of these. (For more information and photos, see the UCLA Fowler Museum catalog, Resplendent Dress, 2013, 180-1.)
