Folks got high on music, dance and community at Kolo Fest. What a glorious way to celebrate the 100<sup>th</sup> year of John Filcich's life, the immense contribution of Yves Moreau to the world, and the experience of dancing passionately together for 2 brief days! Anna Angelova taught traditional Bulgarian dances with lilting voice and precise steps. Sherry Cochran kept the recorded music playing for teachers and sent the phenomenal live music out to zoom participants around the world. At John F's' request the Łowiczanie Polish Folk Dance Ensemble performed a Roma suite with whirling skirts, glittering bride (Clarissa Miller), flamboyant footwork and rhythmic slaps at lightning speed. ## **BEVERLY BARR**

Ed's Note: Below is some information and tributes for Beverly Barr. This first one is from Let's Dance.



#### Beverly Barr (1933-2023)

Beverly Barr died in <u>December</u>, 2023. Besides her family, her passion was international folk dancing. She and her husband, Irwin Barr (who died in 2020), taught international folk dancing in southern California for over 50 years and were well-known in the folk dance community. Besides her weekly dance classes, Beverly was a past-president of the Folk Dance Federation South (1989-92), and an organizer of workshops and camps. In particular, the Irwins provided leadership for the Hess-Kramer weekend camp for 33 years!

Beverly Barr danced as a child and performed in amateur and semi-professional productions throughout early adulthood. She enrolled in an Israeli dance class in 1963.

About five years after she started folk dancing, she began teaching. Her husband Irwin joined her to help with the equipment. Beverly and Irwin appeared on television and Beverly represented folk dancing in other media. She taught at the California Traditional Music Society's events.

Beverly and her husband Irwin taught two daytime and three evening classes each week and were guest teachers at many other groups. Beverly planned group trips and cruises and regularly taught at Southern California's Camp Hess Kramer. She also taught at the 3rd Annual International Folkdance Camp on Santa Catalina.

In addition to her many years as a teacher Beverly was a Past President of the Folk Dance Federation of California, South, Inc.

Irwin M. Barr, born on September 24, 1930, passed away on July 24, 2020.

Dances Beverly taught include Basara, Farewell Marian, Handel with Care, Jamaica, Jiana din Avrig, Krivo Sadovsko Horo, Mistřinská, Pot of Gold, Rekansko Oro, Šarplaninsko, Svekrvino Oro, Tennessee Waltz, Tropotica de la Bălţi, Tzipor K'tana, and Žensko Dračevsko.

### BEVERLY BARR KEEPS SENIORS ON THEIR TOES

"She was born dancing!"

Beverly Barr, a petite dynamo whose active dance card includes teaching international folk and line dancing at the Culver City Senior Center, smiled as she quoted her mother's emphatic response to a long ago query about when she started dancing.

"When I was seven I took tap, the only formal training I ever had," Barr said. "My sister was eight years older and when she and her teenage friends rolled up the living room rug, I was right there dancing along with them."

Then came putting on shows with other neighborhood children in a girlfriend's garage.

"We charged a penny for admission. If someone couldn't pay, that was okay. We just wanted to perform, and tried to imitate what we saw in movies as we put on musicals and choreographed our own dances."

She danced and sang in amateur shows in high school and as an adult appeared in professionally directed benefit productions. In the 1960s she took an Israeli folk dancing class that, with the advent of a different instructor, transitioned into international folk dancing.

Barr, who is gifted with an excellent sense of rhythm and dance memory, had found her passion.

She started teaching folk dancing in 1970. While working in an office she taught three nights a week, using her lunch hour to squeeze in a day class at a nearby location.

Her background includes performing on television and in a documentary about folk dancing, as well as conducting workshops and teaching extensively. Barr and her husband, Irwin, her lifetime dance partner whom she met in high school and promptly married following graduation, continue to perform for retirement homes, parties and benefits.

Her Wednesday afternoon class at the Culver City Senior Center started in March, 2011. "We are so fortunate to have the elegant and talented Beverly Barr offering folk dancing classes to our members," said Debbie Cahill, Senior Program Specialist. "She has a devoted following and always encourages new people to join the fun."

Barr also teaches day and evening classes at various other venues, with her husband assisting.

"All of my students are adults," she said, "and there's also a multi-generational aspect as I've had the grown children and grandchildren of students come to learn folk dancing. If I had to prepare a program six times a week I probably wouldn't be doing this any more. I know my classes, my people, what they like. When I get to my classes, then I decide what to do, based on who's there. And all classes are open to requests. I know thousands of dances, and if we have the music, we'll do it."

The senior center class is conducted on a beginner's level. "We get new people dropping in all the time," Barr said. "I need to adapt to my audience, keep it flexible but with enough variety. The class is really melding. One member is from Ireland so we started doing Irish dances such as Pot of Gold because of him!"

Her first airplane ride was to Hawaii in 1975. "I was a late bloomer," she laughed, "but I've made up for it." She has since taken groups of folk dancers on many trips throughout the world, on land and on cruises, and danced internationally.

The 28th Annual Camp Hess Kramer Workshop Weekend, a pet project, will be held in Malibu in October. She is a past president (1989-1992) of the Folk Dance Federation of California, South which, in the '70s, used to sponsor a workshop weekend that was suspended in the early '80s but revived in her kitchen in 1985.

"It was Irwin's idea to have a new format, getting excellent, experienced teachers that could teach the dances they learned at the various folk dance camps, keeping the cost of the weekend as low as possible so that almost anyone that wanted to attend would be able to," Barr said. Both Barrs credit dance for creating lasting friendships plus health benefits for mind and body.

"You have to learn something new and remember it, using different parts of the brain," she explained. "I've had people into their 90s in my classes, who've danced 20 to 50 years and more, and someone turned 100, still dancing."

Marriage therapists, take note. "For a married couple, it's the most wonderful activity to share," Barr said. "We spend 90% of our time together. When our kids got older and left, we already had a life together through dance."

After 42 years of teaching, with no plans to put up her feet and rest those well-traveled dancing boots, she joyfully looks forward to kicking up her heels – and teaching others to do so – for a very long time to come.

#### Beverly (along with Irwin) was given the Lifetime Achievement Award at the Laguna Folk Dance festival in 2017. Here is the nomination.

Over the years the Barrs have taught multitudes of people to folk dance. They have been teaching in several groups, including many of their own. They have also been in charge of the annual Federation Hess Kramer Dance Camp for over 30 years. Both Beverly and Irwin have held many positions in the Folk Dance Federation of California, South. They are on the Folk Dance Scene committee. They have led many trips both within the USA and abroad, and while caring for all the members of their groups they also taught folk dancing on each and every trip.

Beverly and Irwin have dedicated their lives to furthering the best interests of Folk Dancing.

The recipient is a past President of Folk Dance Federation, South, and over the years has held many other positions in the Federation as well.

The recipient has brought the joy of international folk dance to many people over many decades, teaching children and adults in clubs and camps and at special events.

This recipient this year is actually a duo.

They are the longest members still dancing with the Westwood Co-op.

And have been in charge of the annual Federation Camp Hess Kramer Folk Dance Camp for over 30 years.

In addition to teaching dances and organizing dance camps, and serving the in the Federation, they also strive to bring people together to create a feeling of community by reserving blocks of hotel rooms, and organizing happy hours and dinners at festivals.

I think everyone knows who they are. Beverly and Irwin, please come up.

I'm sure that many people here have their own personal stories and memories about Beverly and Irwin. And I encourage you to share them with one another when you have a chance. Since I have the good fortune to present this award, I get to tell mine.

When I was about 8 years old my parents were copresidents of the Pasadena Folk Dance Co-op when Beverly and Irwin were president of Westwood coop, and I remember Beverly very well from back then. I remember her having a very compelling presence and I think she even scared me a little at that time. Like many folk dancers, I took about a 20year break from dancing, for career and kids, and when I came back, about 10 years ago, there was Beverly, exactly the same as I remembered her! I felt like I was in a time warp. My daughter was dancing with me a lot at that time and she was about 8 years old when she met Beverly. It felt like a very nice full circle.

As one of the nominating letters said: Beverly and Irwin have dedicated their lives to the best interests of folk dance. For me, having known international folk dance all my life – literally – but also having taken a long break from folk dancing, I, personally, feel a tremendous debt to those who have dedicated their lives to the best interests of folk dance. Beverly and Irwin are some of the very best examples. Congratulations and thank you!!

No other group danced my Armenian and Lebanese dances more than Beverly and Irwin's Monday/Friday evening folk dance groups. When I was living in Hollywood, I used to stop in for some dancing at the Brockton School. Then the group would go out to eat. I met the Barrs at the San Diego Conference around 1971. Beverly was an excellent waltzer plus a strong folk dancer for that matter. Eventually Beverly and Irwin ran our program at the UCSB Folk Dance Symposium where the Santa Barbara Conference used to be. I spent countless hours with Beverly reviewing dances and writing up syllabi. Her experiences as a high school student at Fairfax High in the late 40's to 1950 were always interesting.
